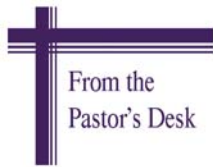

Greetings to my brothers and sisters in Christ,

*The Mass 2025/6, Issue Twenty-Three*

The singing of sacred music adds a plethora of dimensions to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and to all our worship time, but there are certain places and times for it, as there are certain places and times for everything that aids us in worship. During the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, there are explicit points when singing is appropriate. There are places when the Priest should chant certain parts, and there are places when the people should chant responses. For example, the simple greeting of the priest to the people, "The Lord be with you," and the simple reply, "And with your Spirit." This is the call and response of the Mass and there are many points in the Mass that we do this.

We also chant/sing the Mass parts: Kyrie Eleison (Lord have mercy), Gloria, Agnus Dei (Lamb of God), the Great Amen, the Responsorial Psalm, Etc. It is also a praiseworthy practice that the readings and Gospel be chanted during Mass. We chant/sing as we enter the mystery of the Mass, what we call the processional or entrance. There is a misconception as to why we are singing at this part of the Mass, it is not to welcome the celebrant. "The purpose of this chant is to open the celebration, foster the unity of those who have been gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgical season or festivity, and accompany the procession of the priest and ministers" (GIRM, 47).

"In the Dioceses of the United States of America, there are four options for the Entrance Chant [in order of priority]:

1. The antiphon from the Missal or the antiphon with its Psalm from the Graduale Romanum, as set to music there or in another setting;
2. The antiphon and Psalm of the Graduale Simplex for the liturgical time;
3. A chant from another collection of Psalms and antiphons, approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop, including Psalms arranged in responsorial or metrical forms;
4. Another liturgical chant that is suited to the sacred action, the day, or the time of year, similarly approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop" (IBID, 48).

The Offertory chant/singing is the transitional point from the Liturgy of the Word to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. It assists the people in their active participation, as all liturgical singing does. The chanting/singing helps the congregation participate in bringing gifts to the altar, representing their spiritual sacrifices. While bread and wine are brought forward, the singing symbolizes that the faithful are offering their own lives and daily struggles to God to be transformed. Historically, the offertory chant was a Psalm with an antiphon, part of the "Proper" of the Mass, designed to accompany the action until the gifts are placed on the altar. It connects the congregation to Christ's self-offering to the Father, preparing them to participate in the Eucharist.

The Communion chant/singing brings together the voices of all present, emphasizing that the Church is not just a collection of individuals but the united Body of Christ. It also reflects "gladness of heart" upon receiving the Eucharist. The music accompanies the procession to receive Communion, highlighting the faithful as a pilgrim people on a journey. According to the USCCB, it is not merely background music, but an integral part of the liturgy that fosters deeper participation. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) mandates that this chant starts at the Communion of the priest and continues until the last person has received Communion, notes the USCCB. While it is common in some places for this time to be silent or for singing to start later, the liturgical ideal is for this song to accompany the entire procession. After everyone has received communion, a period of silent thanksgiving is appropriate.

The recessional or exiting chant/singing symbolizes bringing Christ's love from the sanctuary out into the world, echoing the command to "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord with your life." It acts as a sending-forth hymn, encouraging the congregation to spread the Good News and continue Christ's mission. While not a required liturgical component, it is a traditional way for the community to end the celebration in singing, just as it began. It often provides a moment to contemplate the mysteries of the Mass and the gift of receiving Jesus.

The final thing that I will mention about liturgical music is that it is not meant to fill the silence or for our entertainment. Silence and music are equally important. If we do not have adequate time for silence, we are not really praying. Liturgical music should help us enter more deeply into the mysteries of the Mass, not distract us from them. Then, once we enter the mysteries, we need the silence to have personal, intimate prayer with God. We must keep the silence sacred and not fall to the temptation to fill every moment with noise. Some of the important places to have sacred silence for personal prayer are before Mass, after each reading/Gospel, after the homily, after Communion, after Mass, and in other places that the Priest will assist in facilitating.

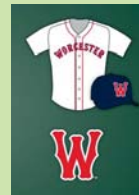

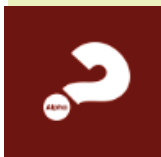

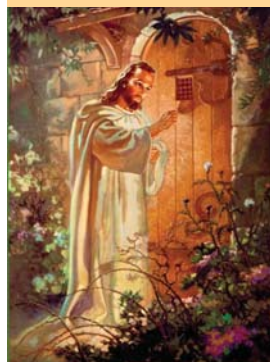
