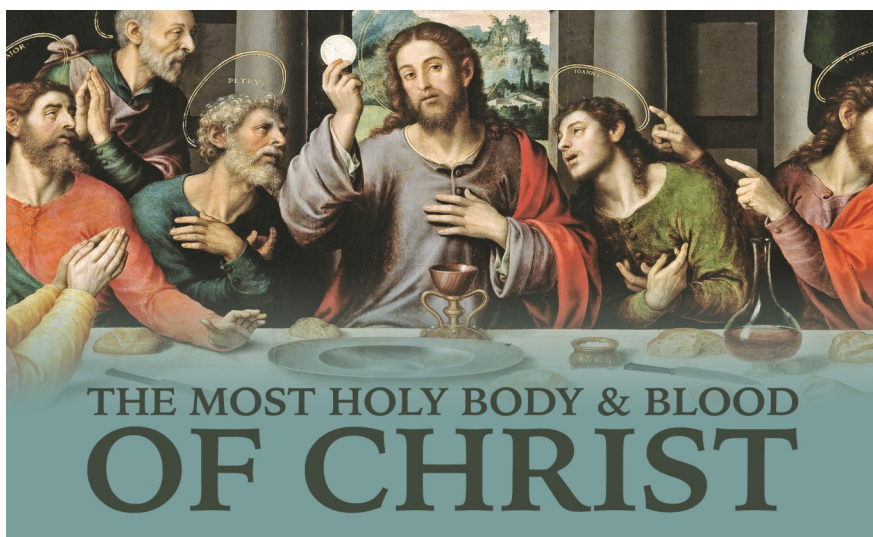

FOCUS: Through the Eucharist, Jesus gives us the strength we need on our journey through life to heaven.

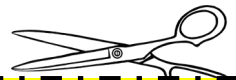

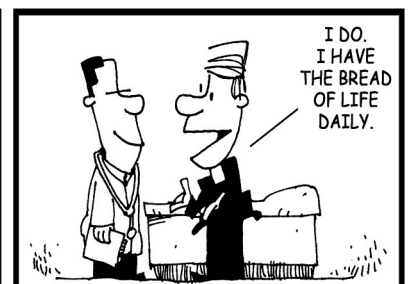
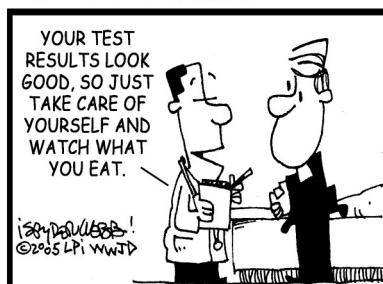
Archbishop's Catholic Appeal

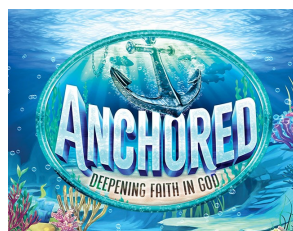

This year's "Anchored" VBS is all about helping our kids to experience God's Word in surprising and unforgettable ways. Some activities are at home, while others are done in person.

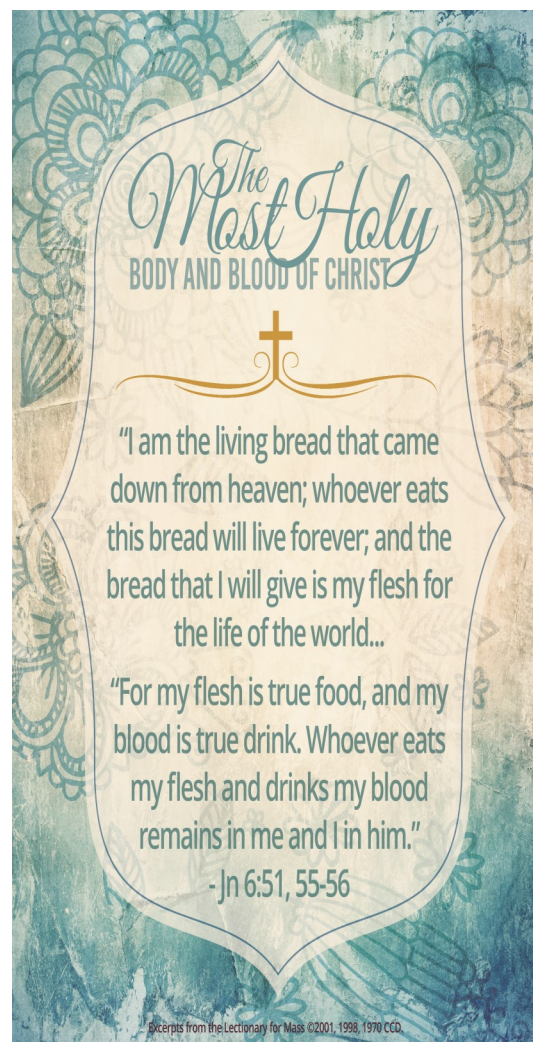
