

Volunteers Needed

We are very much in need of volunteers in the following two areas:

Collection Counters

We need volunteers who are good with handling and counting money to help count collection monies in the Parish Office on Tuesday mornings for a few hours. If you can help, please call us in the office today. Please note that new counters must undergo a background check.

Catechists

We are in the process of planning for Religious Education classes for the children and youth of our parish, which will begin in September. We very much need volunteer catechists to teach the RE classes on Sunday mornings. Teaching and handing on the faith to our children and young people can be very rewarding indeed. Your classroom materials and training will be provided for you, and you must be willing to give 1 hour and 15 minutes most Sunday mornings. If you are interested, please call James at the Parish Office. Again, new catechists must undergo a background check.

Envelopes or No Envelopes?

Are you still receiving donation envelopes in the mail, but you no longer use them because you have switched to online giving or another means of donating? Please let us know as soon as possible in the Parish Office. When these donation envelopes are sent out unnecessarily, it costs our parish a lot of money: money that could instead be used on other things in ministering to our parishioners.

Also, if you have switched to online giving, please contact us in the Parish Office so we can verify your contact information. This makes it easier for us when you ask us to provide you with tax information.

Face Coverings are Now Required

In light of new guidance issued recently by the Oregon Health Authority, face coverings are now required for all people gathered in all churches in all counties in Phases 1 and 2 of reopening in Oregon. Those are excepted who perform "activity that makes wearing a mask...not feasible," like the presider (throughout Mass) and the lectors/cantors (while reading/singing). Exceptions are also made for people with disabilities and children under the age of 5. By archdiocesan requirement, masks must still be used by ministers when distributing Holy Communion.

Catholics in Recovery

CiR combines the spiritual principles of 12-step recovery with the Sacraments of the Catholic Church. Anyone who is recovering from addiction to alcohol, drugs, overeating, gambling, and other unhealthy attachments is welcome. The general recovery meeting is held Saturday mornings at 9 am, and during the coronavirus pandemic, meetings are led over the phone. Just call 425-436-6375, and use access code 416-147.
