

Father's Christmas Letter to the Parish

Dear fellow parishioners,

Greetings! With December 25th still weeks away, I am heartily looking forward to celebrating this Christmas with you. Last year was a challenge with the effects of the pandemic, but we thank God that this year we are able to gather and celebrate the birth of our Savior with our families. This last summer, I was able to visit my family in Kenya, and how grateful I am to God for the gift of the family! I thank God for you too, my parish family, and I thank you for the ongoing love and support as we share our faith together. Our parish family is strong and blessed with so many gifts. Each one of you is a valuable gift to this parish, and I love you.

I know this is a season to share joy, love, and gifts, but we remember that the greatest gift has been given to us by God. Isaiah tells us, "For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given...he shall be called Wonder Counsellor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace (9:6)." Many of us continue to be affected by the coronavirus, perhaps even losing friends and loved ones. The new born child Jesus gives us hope in facing these ongoing challenges. 
