St. Andrew Novena: Start a **Christmas Tradition of Prayer**

The Feast of St. Andrew the Apostle is Nov. 30. Traditionally, beginning that day, this prayer is recited 15 times each day until Christmas. I thought I'd share the prayer with readers of the CCW Newsletter.

This is the called the novena of St. Andrew. not because we are talking to St. Andrew with the prayer, but because Andrew was the first Apostle Jesus called, who then ran to get his brother Simon (Peter) and bring him to Christ. Just as Andrew guided his brother, now he auides us.

A "novena" (meaning "nine") is usually a prayer prayed for 9 days, symbolizing the 9 days of prayer of the Apostles in the Upper Room before Pentecost. But occasionally a novena means any length of time in which a prayer is repeated for a specific petition. The novena prayer is simple, repeated 15 times a day, and can be completed in, seriously, less than 5 minutes. The prayer is as follows:

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born Of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires (mention request here) through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother.

Amen.

A note on the prayer card reads: This is an unusual prayer for several reasons: first, it is not a novena, nor any permutation of nine. Second, it doesn't run exactly according to the Advent Season, but rather, each day of December (and the last of November). Third, though it starts on the Feast of St. Andrew the Apostle, no mention is made of that august saint—nor of any saint except the Virgin Mary. Finally, the provenance of the prayer is a mystery, though it's been said to have started in Ireland about a hundred years ago.

This novena has been very special to me for several years and I hope it is a blessing to you also.
