



Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day is an annual day of remembrance for those who have experienced a pregnancy loss or infant death, which includes miscarriage, stillbirth, SIDS, ectopic pregnancy, termination for medical reasons, and the death of a newborn. A candle will be lit by the Infant of Prague statue the week of October 12th – 18th and a prayer card will be available by the statue to remember those babies that have been lost and pray for their families.

August Board Meeting
Meeting Minutes
August 18, 2025

Attendance: Judy Montych, Sheri Robotham, Anne Bernard, Kathy Wanner, Sandy Bosrock, Mary Vasquez, Cathy Stine, Marcia McGrath, Marty Turner, Deb Lawver, Sue Rogers, Margaret Canfield

The meeting was called to order by President Deb Lawver at 7 pm. Roll call was taken by Recording Secretary Margaret Canfield.

The opening prayer was led by Kathy Wanner. She shared a short history of the life of St Pius X. She also talked about a Tri-Parish bus trip for a Pro-Life walk in Lansing on November 6th. The bus will leave the St Philip parking lot at 8:30 am and return by 4 pm. Also, a service with a plenary indulgence will be held at St Augustine's Cathedral on 9/28..

Officer Reports

The minutes for the May board meeting and the June Installation Banquet were presented by Recording Secretary Margaret Canfield. Mary Vasquez made a motion to approve the minutes and Kathy Wanner seconded. The minutes were approved as presented.

Deb Lawver noted that Judy Beam, VP Membership, is currently in Scotland. Deb handed out the 2025-26 Membership books to board members. She also gave books to the Circle leaders to hand out to their members. Twenty six books were mailed to members. Postage was less than \$26. She noted that last year we had 113 members. We have 105 members this year. Seven members either passed away this past year or moved and three didn't renew their memberships. We have collected \$1800 in dues and \$340 in donations. We have 45 active members, 54 supporting, and 7 honorary.

The Annual Treasury Report was given by Treasurer Sue Rogers. Account balance as of June 30, 2025 was \$2,108.95. Membership dues collected was \$1,220.00. A separate account has been opened for membership dues. Total funds available are \$3,328.95. The records were audited by Tim Lawler and found to be in good shape. He suggested that we consider drawing down the end of the year balance to \$500-1000 as we go forward. Deb Lawver asked that a receipt be provided for all reimbursement requests. Those requests should go to Sue Rogers. Marty Turner made the motion to accept the Treasurer Report. Margaret Canfield seconded. The report was accepted and filed for audit.

Standing Committees

School Service: Marcia McGrath reported that school will start on August 20, beginning with a half day. She asked for clarification on how school grants will be handled this coming year. It was decided that Marcia will continue to take requests and bring them to the board and that we would like to keep the total granted to the \$800 budget total. It was noted that St. Martha's Circle will continue to grant \$200 to Sandy Summers for the altar servers. We can discuss next year if we want to include that expense in our budget

Ways and Means: Judy Montych contacted JOLOL in Marshall about providing us with wreaths to sell. Their cost is \$18 and we would sell them for \$30-35. She is also looking at a butter braid sale for Jan-Feb, to be delivered in March. The cost is \$9 and we could sell them for \$18..

Business Items

Deb Lawver introduced two new board members. Cathy Stine will head Hospitality and Receptions. Sheri Robotham will head Communications. Welcome to both of you.

Deb distributed the Calendar of Events for the coming year. She noted the following additions.

- The September General Meeting and Potluck will be held on 9/29 at 6 pm in the Parish Center. Deb will provide the main entree. We should bring a dish to pass.
- The St Jerome CCW Tri-Parish Potluck will be held on 9/15. Contact Deb if you are planning on going.
- We can begin taking orders for pies in September. Deb Lawver will head up the pie sales, working with Mary Vasquez
- The Christmas Celebration Brunch will be \$25 plus beverage expense. This includes the tip. It will be held at 11 am and is open to all CCW members and guests.
- KDCCW Day of Recollection will be held 2/21 at the Parish Center. We are hosting.
 Kathy Wanner said the day will include scriptural skits.
- We have not scheduled a card party this year. We can look at doing so later.
- The First Holy Communion Reception should be the first Sunday in May.

Superfest would like us to help provide baked goods. They are needed by 5:30 on 9/12. They can be dropped off at the Parish Center. They are requesting items to be individually wrapped.

We are gathering cards for Fr. Pat to celebrate his 40th ordination anniversary. Gift suggestions include gift cards for Lowes, Menards, gas cards. Anne Bernard will collect the

cards and wrap them together in a gift box. Deb Lawver will send out an email with the date needed and details. This will be a surprise, so don't let Father know!

Other Items

Sandy Bosrock asked that we send get well cards to Jim and Mary Faber. Anne Bernard will send them out.

Deb Lawver shared the following information:

- Sue Campbell, St Jerome CCW President, sent details about the upcoming Tri-Parish Potluck. The event will open at 5:30 pm, with dinner at 6pm, followed by a guest speaker. If attending, we are asked to bring a side dish or salad.
- Fr. Pat will begin offering Spirituality Meetings on the 4th Monday of the month, beginning in September.
- Fr. Pat will host the Arts and Music Festival again this September on the 26th through the 28th. He is asking for monitors to help with the event on those days, Contact Deb Lawver if you would like to volunteer
- Coffee and donuts will start back up after the 9 am Mass beginning 9/28.

The closing prayer was led by Kathy Wanner. The meeting adjourned at 8 pm.
