JOE INVITED BILL

After Mass, Joe approached his pastor: "Father, you talked about inviting people to our

services. I had an experience in the army. Bill and I were buddies, both Catholics. But Bill never went to Mass. We were having a five-day mission on the base, I asked Bill to come along, but he had some kind of excuse. The second and third nights more excuses. Finally, on the fourth night, he came with me to the chapel. Something hit him because from then on he went with me to Mass and Communion regularly. That was twenty years ago. Haven't seen him since, but he writes to me every year and thanks me for asking him to go to that mission."

Jesus tells us in today's Gospel that the Kingdom of Heaven is like a king who gave a marriage feast for his son. The Kingdom of Heaven means the family of God here on this earth. The marriage feast is the table loaded with spiritual food.

My thought for this week is that every one of us is a servant of the great King, Christ is His Son. The Heavenly Father sends us out to invite everyone to share the spiritual feast offered by His Church.

Who are the people we can invite? Practically everyone. Too many of our fellow Catholics have never attended a mission, a retreat, or a study session. Fallen-away Catholics often need only a little nudge to start them on their way back to the family of God.

I am thinking especially of the many who attend no church and of our friends of other faiths who are looking for the spiritual nourishment we have.

Where do we meet these possible guests? They could be neighbors, classmates, workers, even relatives. They could be Catholics or non-Catholics. They could be chance acquaintances at a game, at the store, in the doctor's waiting Don't room. limit vour invitation to so-called respectable people. Invite the underprivileged, the outcast, Assinner. the king commanded in our Gospel: "Go out and invite all you can find, both bad and good."


Invite them to a regular Sunday Mass, or preferably to some special service – Midnight Mass, First Communion, a baptism, Confirmation, or a wedding.

Suppose they turn down your invitation. Well, you have done your duty, a duty of faith, a duty of charity. You are promoting understanding between different faiths. You are showing that your faith means something to you.

You are concerned, considerate, and kind enough to want others to share the spiritual wedding feast we enjoy whenever we attend Holy Mass.

THE FAITHFUL DISCIPLE

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I would guess we've all experienced lean times along with better times. Ramen noodles and boxed mac and cheese in college, fine dining with "rich food and choice wines" once we got real jobs, then back to pizza and beer when balancing school tuition, car payments, and kids' growing feet. Paul has seen it all and much worse; after all, he is writing from a prison cell! Yet, rather than focus on his own troubles, he expresses gratitude for the support of the Philippians and assures them that God will provide. Paul is not writing about food, fine wine, or financial security, but the "glorious riches in Christ Jesus." No matter our circumstances, we, too, can trust that God will give us what we need.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Imagine Paul, stuck in a prison cell – hungry, thirsty, and probably in pain. And yet he seeks to bolster the Philippian Church, assuring them, "I can do all things in him who strengthens me," and thanking them: "Still, it was kind of you to share in my distress." What a powerful faith, and a witness to gratitude of God's gifts - including the gift of people who love us. I've been fortunate to have met people who, facing a chronic disease, the loss of a loved one, or physical challenges, still seem to be looking out for everyone else. Nearly to a person, they say they draw on their faith - and I've had the rare opportunity to hear their stories as an editor for a Catholic magazine. They inspire me to keep talking to God every day, so when that next challenge comes – and it will – I, too, can turn to my faith for strength. And it doesn't stop there. By our example, we can accompany those around us as they carry their burdens, assuring them that they don't face their trials alone.

ACTION

St. Paul says: "I can do all things in him who strengthens me." Keep a gratitude journal and write down the ways God has provided for you. Thank God, and then reach out and thank the people who have supported you when things got tough.

The Parable of the Wedding Feast MT 22:1-14

- # Describe a wedding that you have attended. Explain what happens at a wedding feast to those who have never been to a wedding.
- # Why does Jesus use the image of a wedding feast to describe the kingdom of heaven?
- # In Jesus' day, people were generally supplied with appropriate wedding garments if they didn't bring one themselves. The man who was thrown out refused the garment and was unwilling to pay reverence to the king and dress properly for the occasion. What does this teach us about entrance into the kingdom of heaven?



St. Teresa of Ávila (Feast Day October 15) MARCH 28, 1515 – OCTOBER 4, 1582

St. Teresa was born in central Spain, amidst that country's greatest century. She was from a large, middle-class and pious family. As a girl, Teresa dreamed of being a martyr or a hermit. As a woman, Teresa stood on her own two feet, even in the man's world of her time. She lived what she demanded of others, and she did it all with a cheerful disposition and a rich personality that overcame deep-seated opposition. She was a mystic, writer, and reformer of the Carmelite order. She was an influential and pivotal figure of her generation. Teresa was the first female non-martyr to have her feast day extended to the universal Church, and, due to the profundity of her mystical writings, she was declared a Doctor of the Church by Paul VI in 1970.


Fun Facts!
