That greeting of St. Paul is so effective and relevant even today. It just seems that our world never learns. We look back in history; wars after wars, threats of violence and viciousness, destruction of peoples' homes and places of work, families and buildings built at the cost of so many lives and sacrifices. Will we ever learn? Only if we dedicate ourselves to the pursuit of true peace within ourselves, between ourselves and God and our families and neighbors. That is where we start. 


NOVENA FOR LIFE
