Romans 8, 26

St. Paul, our Cathedral Parish Patron and "Apostle to the Gentiles" as he is referred to, that is (the Non-Jewish people) refers to the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God, as coming to our aid, especially when it comes to praying. He goes on to say "for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit intercedes with inexpressible groanings."

All of us at times have difficulty expressing ourselves, our adoration, contrition for sin, thanksgiving for God's blessing and our asking for our needs, but as we are reminded, we don't pray unaided or alone because God accompanies our prayers with His Spirit, who assists and makes up for our inadequacies and weaknesses. God is so good even to the extent of completing our attempts to pray as we should. The message is: DON'T GIVE UP, DON'T GIVE IN TO THE TEMPTATION THAT WE CAN'T PRAY AS WE OUGHT. God is here in our lives to perfect and complete our meager attempts, even to pray.

What counts are our efforts, the time we take to pray and our sincerity as we approach our God. We need to be, all of us, People of Prayer with an open communication with a loving God and our assurance that God accepts our time and effort to adore, ask pardon for our sins (contrition), thank Him for His many gifts that we often take for granted, and petition (supplication) for our daily needs (ACTS).

We never pray alone. The Spirit of God joins us and makes up for our own unworthiness and weaknesses, PRAY OFTEN! BE A PEOPLE OF PRAYER!
