These are the final words of St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians proclaimed as the second reading (3rd really, because the Psalm and refrain are also sacred readings—in song).


The whole story of redemption and salvation are summed up by this letter of St. Paul, our parish patron, in the message preceding this quotation.

May we always use this blessed name with the honor, respect and reverence that it deserves!! Identifying our brother, Jesus the Lord, of whom we are disciples.




