And, of course, we know that He has done this by sending his only begotten Son to live, die and resurrect for us. With these words from Isaiah, or whoever wrote them, we can look to as our continual living promise of salvation by Jesus Christ.


In the Responsorial Psalm which immediately follows, we sing: "I shall live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life", the fulfillment of that promise of the Isaiah reading.

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis introduced himself to the world after his election as Pope with these words: "I am a sinner," and honestly uniting himself to all of us who share this title. Yes, we all are sinners, but sinners who have been saved and forgiven, redeemed from our sins and not condemned for eternity—a wonderful reason to rejoice and be glad.

Each week we gather as CHURCH and we hear four readings, one sung—the Responsorial Psalm and three others, including the Gospel proclamation. We need to be attentive to these revelations of God's plan for us as to how we live our lives here on earth; such richness and beauty in these words from Sacred Scripture.

We should be able to take at least one lesson each Sunday, ponder it and allow this Word to change us some way, to be able to reflect Christ and bring Him ever more clearly and visibly present through our discipleship and lives.

May we all rejoice and be glad that the Lord has saved us!

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL

Next Sunday, announcement Sunday, we begin our annual appeal for the support of our Bishop and the ministries of our Diocese of Yakima, an essential effort in order to carry out the mission of the "greater Church," our diocese. The theme for this year is "ACA: Building a Young Church", based on the synodal findings of consultations held this past spring around the diocese. Universally the finding of these synodal conversations urged that "Youth" should be our priority. But, along with that first, we also are aware that we have to work together to build, not only a young Church, but "one Church" continuing to bring together all of our people; old and young, Hispanic and Anglo, rural and urban, to become a strong enthusiastic "people of God." Also we are reminded of our need to build a "new Church" particularly in small rural communities in need of worship spaces, but unable to finance their construction.

All of these needs are supported by our contribution to the Annual Catholic Appeal as well as several teaching ministries and service efforts by our diocese and parishes. So, even though we as a Cathedral Parish are facing our own financial efforts to restore or our former Cathedral School as our Parish Center after the first of the year, this annual Catholic Appeal needs the participation and generosity of every parishioner.

Let's get together to surpass our goal of \$104,581 (16% of our Sunday and Holiday collections, the percentage of every parish goal).

Donations exceeding our goal will be returned to our parish—a first payment on our Parish Center restoration.
