When the scholar of the law asked Jesus in todays Gospel passage from Matthew "Which announcement in the law is the greatest?" Jesus answered so beautifully "You shall love the Lord your God will all your heart, with all your soul and will all your mind" and, like this, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" really reducing all the details of life to one virtue: LOVE!! Because it is there that the whole law and prophets depend.


It is easy to understand what love is. We experience it, each in his or her own way, but, if we were to be asked to define love, it is sure there would be as many answers as there are people.

The Love of which Jesus speaks is not the 'love sung about by the Pop Singers of today, but it's a love personified and exemplified by Jesus, Himself, who came into this world to Teach us by example what true love is. If we look at the life of Jesus we see the first part of love is "giving". He gave His time, His energy, his healing power and finally even His life for us.

The second part is similar, but different, it is being forgiving. Over and over again Jesus forgave the offenses and sins of the people and that expression of "love" extends even to today. God and His Son are the best manifestations of LOVE and our model.

We too need to be giving and forgiving of one another and examples of love in the world, that needs true love more than ever.


We ask the Lord today to help form us into true examples in imitation of Jesus Christ, of what true love is all about—a people that is really giving and forgiving.




2024 Annual Appeal Projected Distribution of Collected Funds

ALL SOULS' DAY



You are invited to place pictures of your deceased family and friends on the special altar (in the Baptistry area of the Cathedral) to remind us for whom we should be praying.


2) ALL SOULS ENVELOPES
