
Following the parable Jesus tells again in today's Gospel, about the wise and foolish virgins, He adds the above warning and challenge to us today, his present disciples of the 21st century.

We are reminded that this first day of the rest of our lives might also be the last, because we don't know when or where God will summon us to give an account of our lives.

We live our ordinary (or extraordinary) lives day by day, so often unknowing and unconscious of the possibility that each day could be the one where God summons us to an accounting of our own lives and conduct, but we also are assured that one day He will come again, either in general to all creatures or to us individually.

Not that we should fear for the future but to call us to be always ready—to live each day as if it could be our last here on earth; and, if we are trying to live as God wants us to live, He will keep His promise of everlasting life, for eye has not seen nor ear heard nor has it entered into the minds of human beings what God has prepared for those who love Him!

So as we approach the end of the liturgical year, on the Feast of Christ the Kind two weeks from today, and the joyful penitential season of Advent, of preparation for His Coming, may we be always ready for whenever God calls us to Himself.

We are all sinners but sinners who are redeemed by Jesus Christ through His death and resurrection and we share the HOPE of eternal life. Therefore as St. Paul concludes this reading: "Console one another with these words."
