
Virtues are good habits acquired through learning and constant practice over a long period of time that become characteristics of a person. For example, a person who practices to give even in small quantities, whether it is time, money or talents, will eventually become a generous person and be known as a generous person. A person, who begins to pray for a couple of minutes everyday, will eventually be a prayerful person. A person, who constantly exercises and eats a healthy diet, will eventually be in good shape. For virtues to grow and flourish, the environment has to be one of consistency, discipline, sacrifice and practice. Indulgence, inconsistency and fear of pain and failure will halt the development of vir-

A gift on the other hand is something we receive without any effort or cost. Some people are virtuous because they were gifted those qualities whether these are athletic, moral or spiritual talents. Perhaps you think you have no gifts. However, everyone has been given some talents or gifts, and everyone has the same potential to develop other virtues. We are all called to develop the virtue of holiness, the highest of all virtues.

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus is inviting us to take a good look ourselves and figure out what are the gifts that he has already given us, and that we need to be grateful for. We are also invited to see what virtues do we need to develop so that we can be happy ourselves and therefore help those in our lives to be happy as well. Perhaps you are one who received five talents or the one who received only one. Are you making these talent(s) flourish or are you being held back by self-indulgences, indiscipline, or fear of suffering and failure?

Remember to with baby steps. Do not be discouraged if you cannot yet pray thirty rosaries everyday like St. Padre Pio, or that you are not in as good a shape as Msgr. Ecker. Begin with one Hail Mary and with a ten-minute walk everyday. And who knows, eventually you might even beat St. Padre Pio or make the next Olympics.

What virtues would you like to develop this coming Advent season in preparation for Christmas, and what are the baby steps you need to take?








