I remember when I used to work at Fred Meyer's in Kennewick as a Price Changer. When all the departments were done setting up signs and sale prices, and free coffee and refreshments were set for customers, even if it was earlier than the advertised opening hours, the store director would gather us all up. Then, over the paging system of the store, he would give a motivational speech like Mel Gibson in Braveheart before going into battle, and then we would all line up on the sides of all the doors. At the cry of "let them be opened," all the doors would be simultaneously opened. As people charged into the store, all of us employees would clap everyone in. It was scary, ridiculous, joyful, sad and hilarious all at the same time. So much angst, expectation and preparation for acquiring material things that will eventually decay.

How are we preparing to open wide the doors of the home of our heart for the coming of Son of God this Christmas? Can you imagine how different the world, and even our own life would be if everyday we would anticipate Christ with the same angst, expectation and preparation we do for other events? I hope you slept in on the morning of Black Friday, but I hope you stay awake to be able to recognize Jesus in those who are hungry and thirsty, in the foreigners, the homeless, the sick, and the prisoners. I hope you stay awake to be able to love and to forgive. Are you awake?




#### ST. VINCENT CENTERS
