


# WHERE DO YOU LIVE?

When I was a seminarian, I was given the opportunity to travel to Asia to learn about some of the different Asian cultures, and some of their gifts and their struggles. The Maryknoll Fathers and Brothers were the ones hosting us throughout this adventure in Asia. One day when I was in Taiwan, one of the Maryknoll fathers approached me. He encouraged me in my vocation and gave me some advice. He gave me advice regarding homesickness. What he didn't realize is that I was too excited about getting to know Taiwan and visiting some of their ministry sites to get homesick. He still gave me good advice.

He said to me that home is not a building or a place. He said that our home as Christians is a person, the Person of Jesus Christ. I never thought about this before until this Maryknoll father mentioned it to me. He is right. For Jesus himself says, "I am the true vine... Abide in me as I abide in you" (Jn 15:1,4). So as long as one has an intimate friendship with Christ, one will always be home with Him. We always carry our family and friends with us, but it doesn't mean that they can always be with us. With Jesus Christ, it is different. He is always with us. And if we open our heart to Him, He opens his heart to us. His heart is Paradise. His heart is our home where we need to live to be fulfilled with every blessing and true happening.

Where do you live? This is what the disciples asked Jesus. It was not a specific place where he lived. Rather it was the Will of the Father where He lived. The disciples came and saw all the miracles that He did and heard the words that he said. His deeds and words were miraculous. This is where he lived, in His Fathers' Heart. How wonderful and miraculous your life would be if your home were the Heart of Christ? Where do you live?

- 1. Within a couple of weeks you will be given an opportunity as members present and past, of the family of St. Paul Cathedral in Yakima-to have a share:
- 2. In the restoration of our Parish Center, the former, St. Paul Cathedral School, valued in replacement value by contractors between 50 and 60 million dollars. As you are aware, the disastrous flood of '20 on the top floor devastated the building and rendered it unavailable for educational, recreational, evangelical, and social activities and affairs which are the essence of the mission of your parish life.
- 3. We hope to embark on an effort to further beautify our Cathedral Church and its surroundings with new pavers in the courtyard and entry area and to repaint the exterior which is beginning to chip. Essential roof repair and maintenance also need to be carried out.
- 4. Our Parish plant, Cathedral, rectory, parish annex, office building, and Haven (for young adults and college student centers) were built and /or purchased by the sacrificial offerings of our parents, families and past generations. Now we present an opportunity to preserve and hand down to future generations the treasure that is ours.
- 5. Please keep alert to upcoming information and notices as we, as responsible stewards of our parish properties, work to preserve, improve and beautify. Our goal for the 1st phase, which will just cover necessary repairs, along with insurance, to allow your parish to better fulfill its mission to serve our people and our diocese more fully and to preserve our treasured resources.


