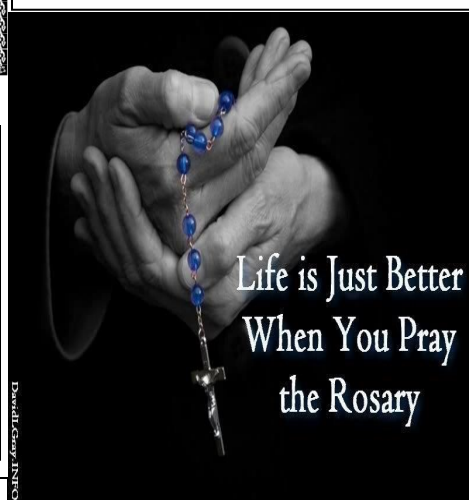

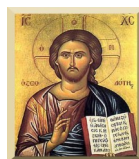

Women of the Church January Study—Tidbit on Tamar

Tamar was a woman in the Old Testament who lost two husbands;

She became the wife of Judah, the fourth born son of Jacob, and her father-in-law. Prior to taking Tamar as his wife, Judah treated Tamar unfairly. He refused to follow the rules of levirate marriage, which were the custom. He confined Tamar to live as a widow, rather than marrying or freeing her.

Tamar developed a plan for her own justice. She confronted Judah's mistreatment. Following this, Judah recognized his sin and acknowledged his failure to provide for Tamar. Tamar and Judah later bore twin boys; King David. and later Jesus were born out of the line of one of these, Perez. Tamar is mentioned in the lineage of Jesus in Matthew 1:3.
