REFLECTION FOR THIS WEEK'S READINGS: A LITTLE FAITH Today our readings are about faith, frustration, and how much is enough. Habakkuk is a complainer having an argument with God. Timothy is encouraging a community challenged by cowardice and the apostles want more faith than they have. Things aren't happening fast enough for any of them or for us. All of them and we want God to do something sooner rather than later and we want God to give us a reason to believe that it will all work out. What does God do? God puts it back on them—and us—telling Habakkuk to describe the world he wants; telling the apostles to do more than the expected. Doing more with less is a familiar phrase today and a reminder that a little faith may be enough even for the most difficult times.

BAPTIZED AND SENT: the Church of Christ on mission in the world World Mission Sunday is on October 20. However, this year there is a departure from what has occurred in the past. Pope Francis called for the entire month of October to be recognized as an **EXTRAORDINARY MISSIONARY MONTH**. This is to celebrate the hundredth anniversary of the Apostolic Letter *Maximum Illud*, written by Pope Benedict XV, in which he tried to give new impetus to the missionary task of proclaiming the Gospel. Of course, this was in response to Jesus' instruction to "go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature" (Mk 16:15). Next week a special "yellow" World Mission Collection Envelope will be included in the bulletin for you to donate towards. Please be as generous as you can.

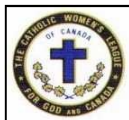

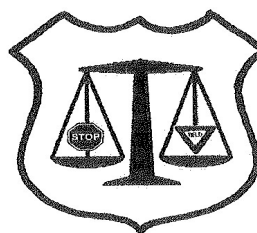

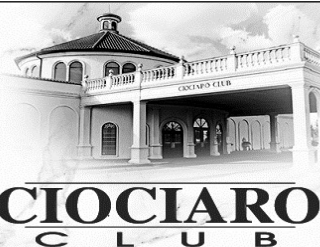
