Gospel Reading Luke 4:1-13

In the desert, Jesus is tempted by the devil.

"In each of the three Synoptic Gospels, after his baptism, Jesus is reported to have spent forty days in the desert, fasting and praying. In Luke and in Matthew, the devil presents three temptations to Jesus. The devil tempts Jesus to use his power to appease his hunger, he offers Jesus all the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will worship him, and he tempts Jesus to put God's promise of protection to the test. In each case, Jesus resists, citing words from Scripture to rebuke the devil's temptation.



Each temptation that Jesus faces offers insight into the spirituality we hope to develop as we keep the forty days of the Season of Lent. We can trust God to provide for our material needs. We worship God because God alone has dominion over us and our world. We can trust God to be faithful to his promises. Jesus' rejection of the devil's temptations shows that he will not put God to the test. Grounding himself on the Word and authority of Scripture, Jesus rebukes the devil by his confidence in God's protection and faithfulness.

This Gospel highlights for us one of the central themes of the Season of Lent. We are dependent upon God for all that we have and all that we are. Anything that leads us to reject this dependency or to distrust its sufficiency, is a temptation from the devil. Luke ends his report of Jesus' temptation in the desert by noting that the devil departs for a time. The implication is that the devil will return. Jesus knows that he will be tempted again in the Garden of Gethsemane. The depth of Jesus' trust in God is shown most fully when Jesus rejects the temptation to turn away from the task God has given to him. Jesus' final rebuke of the devil is his sacrifice on the Cross.

Jesus' responses to the temptations of the devil teach us how we can respond to temptation. As we start our journey through Lent, this Sunday's Gospel calls us to adopt the same confidence that Jesus had in the face of temptation: God's word alone will suffice, God's promise of protection can be trusted, and God alone is God." *From Loyolapress.com

Today's readings give us much to ponder about the nature of faith and our motivations for cultivating (through grace) a relationship with God. It is especially hard during this pandemic era to feel connected to each other and to our church communities, and it might seem like God is very far away, or that we wish God would do something really spectacular to indicate our prayers are being heard, or that we are cherished. All of the readings today provide reassurance that God is very near, inviting us to meet God in the word of scripture and Jesus who is the Word. On this First Sunday of Lent, let us encourage each person in our communities to ask themselves, "what would help me feel closer to God today?", and listen for the response of the Holy Spirit. Perhaps it is spending an extra few minutes after mass in prayer, or rereading the gospel very slowly, or phoning a loved one, or spending time in quiet contemplation. Life Isn't About What You Think ... "It's not a fun place to visit, the wilderness, the desert. There's an old Roman road that leads out of Jericho, and it



winds up through the hills to Jerusalem. I remember going there and having a rather harrowing experience in a bus in that long, dry, barren, awe-inspiring desert and wilderness. There's a Greek Orthodox monastery on the side of the mountain. It's a beautiful, beautiful place. And there's one little cross at the top of the hill on the peak looking out over the wilderness, the chasm below with a shepherd and some herd of his sheep perched on the hillside all across. And that's where they say Jesus spent 40 days and nights until he was worn out, his resistance low after fasting and being tempted for 40 days by Satan.

Temptation's not a fun place to visit either, is it? Temptation's a lonely place, a difficult place, a place of testing. But that's where Jesus is in the gospel reading today, right in the center of temptation. He's already been tempted for 40 days, and then Satan goes straight for his soul. He plays hardball. Satan comes back with three final temptation doozies after 40 days of temptation. If Jesus - think about it - if Jesus, the Son of God, is opposed by the strong forces of evil, if he's not exempt from them, who is? 

WE NEED YOU!




