Gospel Reading Luke 10:25-37

The parable of the Good Samaritan

"As Jesus continues his journey to Jerusalem, he is confronted by a scholar of the law who wants to test him. In the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, Jesus is asked about the greatest commandment. Here, in Luke's Gospel, the lawyer asks what we must do to inherit eternal life. In the other two Gospels, Jesus answers the question by quoting Deuteronomy 6:5, on loving God with all your heart, and Leviticus 19:18, on loving your neighbor. Here Jesus asks the expert to answer this question, "What is written in the law?" The man is caught and responds with Deuteronomy 6:5. This verse is one of the most important prayers in Judaism, and it was said twice a day in Jesus' time. Love of God and love of neighbor are what is required for eternal life. Jesus' response is simple, "Do this and you will live."

Having been shown up by Jesus, the lawyer tries another question: Who is my neighbor whom I must love like myself? In the society of Jesus' time, with its distinctions between Jews and Gentiles, men and women, clean and unclean, this was a trick question. Jesus responds with one of the most beautiful of all the parables, the Good Samaritan. It is found only in Luke's Gospel.

The road from Jerusalem to Jericho descends 3,300 feet in just 17 miles. Its narrow passes and rocky terrain made it an easy place for bandits to wait for travelers. The traveler in this parable is identified only as "a certain man." Luke uses this phrase in many of his parables so that the audience, Jew or Gentile, could identify with the man. After the attack, the man is left for dead, naked and bleeding on the side of the road. A priest comes along, but rather than helping, as one might expect, he moves to the other side of the road.

Another religious person comes along, a Levite who assists in the Temple. His reaction is the same as the priest's. Both of them choose to not even find out if the man is alive. A third person comes along. The listeners would probably expect him to be an Israelite. This would make the parable a criticism of the religious leadership. Instead he is a Samaritan, an Israelite's most hated neighbor. Samaritans were descendents of Jews from the northern part of the country, who had intermarried with Gentiles and did not worship in Jerusalem. The Samaritan not only goes over to the injured man but cleans his wounds, puts him on his own animal, takes him to an inn to recover, and promises to pay all his expenses. The hated enemy is the compassionate neighbor in this parable.

Jesus has demolished all boundary expectations. It is not social definitions such as class, religion, gender, or ethnicity that determines who is our neighbor. A neighbor is a person who acts with compassion toward another. The point becomes not who deserves to be loved as I love myself, but that I become a person who treats everyone with compassion.

When Jesus asks the lawyer who was the neighbor in the story, the lawyer can't bring himself to say it was the Samaritan. All he says is that it was "the one who treated him with mercy." Jesus' response was similar to that of the first discussion: "Go and do likewise." The lawyer, and we, know what is right. The key is to do it. *From Loyolapress.com

FAMILY OF PARISHES – FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS #7

Question 13: What will happen to the preparation of our children for the sacraments and what about the celebrations of the sacraments themselves?

Now that we are a family of parishes, we have a luxury of being able to offer greater sacramental preparation to our young people. We have more space and more people working together for them. It will provide different opportunities also for those interested in helping with preparation. Not all preparation will happen at one site but will occur in different places that will help accommodate schedules. As far as celebrating the sacraments, those will still take place in the parish church where the child and their family practice their faith. Again, if there is an issue of scheduling, being a family of parishes provides more times and places but we would encourage that those celebrations be in the each of the parishes where the young person is a part of the community.

Question 14: What will happen to parish offices as well as future office hours?

There is still some work to be done with regards to this topic. One thing the pandemic has shown us is that there are multiple ways of communicating with each other. The other thing to remember is that many still haven't returned thanks to this COVID situation. We will be examining over the next little while so we can understand what each parish has a need for, and what will be the best way to serve that need. We will make sure and communicate any changes regarding office hours, locations and so forth but don't be surprised if there is a different voice answering the phone or another face at a desk. As a family of parishes, we are working with each other, for each other to help as many as possible to keep their connection with Christ.



This weekend marks our first as a family. There is every good chance that there will be a few bumps in the road as well as more to come but with the grace of God we will overcome them and find our way along the path to the Kingdom. I would continue to ask your prayers for all the members of the Rose City Central Catholic Family of Parishes. As we continue our journey through this world, it is comforting to know that we aren't alone but that we have an even greater family journeying with us.

OLPH SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL- Vincentian Meditation: (Luke 10:25-37) "There are scripture scholars who say that there is a very subtle twist to the end of the parable. Jesus asks the lawyer: "Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbour to the man who fell in with robbers?" The answer came, "The one who treated him with mercy." It would seem that in asking the lawyer that question, Jesus was saying equivalently to him, "You asked Me 'who was my neighbour?'" That was not a good question. The question you should have asked me was: "To whom can I BE neighbour? And the answer to that question is, 'the first poor person you meet on the road.'" (McCullen, Deep Down Things, p. 141) Can you be a neighbour to the first poor person in our neighbourhood? If so, when you come to Mass please bring the following items with you.....**KD (macaroni & cheese), tomato soup, rice, canned vegetables (no corn please), crackers, canned meat, canned fruit, & cereal.**





**Bishop Fabbro's Letter to the Faithful about our Truth
and Reconciliation Fund**

July 4, 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, At the end of July, Pope Francis will be making an Apostolic Journey to Canada stopping in Quebec, Alberta and Nunavut.

Drawing on the theme of "Walking Together", the visit will include a combination of public and private events with an emphasis on Indigenous participation. It is Pope Francis' desire to meet with Indigenous groups, parish communities, clergy, religious and lay people. As part of this historic trip, we anticipate that the Pope will offer a formal apology on Canadian soil for the Church's participation in the Residential School System. In September 2021, the Bishops of Canada offered an apology and asked Pope Francis to receive a delegation of Indigenous Peoples. In April of this year, Pope Francis received this delegation and apologized to the representatives from Indigenous groups who met with him in Rome (1 April 2022). In my role as the Bishop of London, I have apologized to the Indigenous People of this land (27 September 2021) and committed our Diocese to walk on the path of healing and reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples. As an expression of our commitment to healing and reconciliation, I have also committed the Diocese of London to \$1.8-million over the next five years, and I have pledged the resources and the support of the people of our Diocese for this project. We are calling this fund the "Diocese of London Truth and Reconciliation Fund". I invite you to be part of the process of healing and reconciliation. Your efforts, combined with the work and prayers of many others, are important as we walk together on this path towards truth, healing and reconciliation. There are different ways in which you can participate: prayer, the ongoing education opportunities offered by our Diocese, taking part this summer in local events and activities so as to better understand Indigenous people in this region, and contributing to our Diocese of London Truth and Reconciliation Fund.

I thank you in advance for your support of this worthy cause.

Pope Francis' Apostolic Journey to Canada to meet with Indigenous Peoples is an encouragement to all of us. Non-indigenous people in Canada have benefitted from the process of colonization, often at the expense of those who have lived on this land for millennia. If we seek to follow Jesus as his missionary disciples, we must offer ourselves and our resources, and be committed to walk with Indigenous Peoples on the path of justice, healing and reconciliation. May the Spirit guide and shape our actions.


