Gospel Reflection: Matthew 10:26-33

Jesus assures the Twelve that God cares about them.

We read today's Gospel in the context of last week's Gospel in which Jesus sent the twelve disciples to proclaim the kingdom of heaven. In between last week's reading and today's reading, Jesus has predicted that the disciples will face difficulties in their mission. Many people will not receive them well, even within the land of Israel. Even family members will turn away from

the disciples because of the disciples' commitment to Jesus and the kingdom. Today's Gospel offers the disciples consolation against this difficult truth.

This section of Matthew's Gospel should be read in the context of Matthew's intended audience, a Jewish-Christian community. The Gospel alludes to the dangers and persecutions that this community has most likely already faced and will continue to face. To reassure this community, Matthew recalls for them the encouraging words of Jesus that we read today.

In this Gospel passage, Jesus might be understood as putting suffering in perspective. The disciples of Jesus are called upon to keep their focus on God. Those who can harm the body do not have ultimate power; God does. Still persecution and suffering can not be avoided or prevented. But Jesus reassures his disciples that God knows and cares about what happens to his children.



We might not face the same type of persecution, but we do experience difficulties as we endeavor to live a Christian life. Sometimes we let the opinions of others prevent us from doing what we know to be right. We need the reminder that what God thinks about us is more important. We are reassured by the promise that God cares for us and protects us. \*From Loyolapress.com



#### LITURGY DURING COTTAGE SEASON

In most parishes, many of the aspects of parish life slow down in the summer, or even take a break. Following the rhythm of the school year, family vacations, and time at the cottage, parish activities enter into a relaxing lull. (Of course, for parishes in cottage country, things may be picking up!) Many, many people get at least some time for relaxation and refreshment, preparing to ramp up again with renewed vigour after Labour Day. The liturgy, however, just keeps on going. The liturgical calendar knows nothing about this yearly rhythm, and the Sundays of Ordinary Time continue along as they always do. Sunday is always Sunday, regardless of the time of year. Even in this "ordinary" season, it's a celebration of the "day of the Lord": entering into the death and resurrection of Christ, coming together as the baptismal priesthood, and experiencing a foretaste of the kingdom of God. None of this is diminished when we're otherwise experiencing some "down time." Practically speaking, especially for some liturgical ministries, this is a bit of a conundrum. The challenge is to figure out how to honour everyone's changing calendars during this time, allow some personal renewal, and still make sure our Sunday liturgies are celebrated appropriately fully. For some ministries it is straightforward to keep on going, and scheduling works the way it always does: there can always be at least one lector for the readings; there can usually be found enough ministers of communion to serve the needs of the number of people in the assembly. Homilies should never be skipped on Sundays, and can get the same care as usual, even if a lack of air conditioning might call for them to be mercifully just a little shorter on occasion. Sometimes the biggest change is for musicians, especially choirs. It's often the established practice that choirs simply take the summer off. Rehearsals are put on hold. Yet, especially with smaller groups, it's worth asking singers if they can keep on going. A "skeleton crew" of singers can sustain their ministry among the assembly, even without weekly rehearsals, making use of music that's familiar to all. And there's no need to pare back the music, reciting what would normally be sung; even a single cantor can lead the assembly in just as many "parts of the mass" as always. The music might be a lot simpler, with fewer people and only familiar music, but even then the sung liturgy is still fully functioning. \*Scripture commentary and reflections by Andrea Di Giovanni. 

#### DID YOU KNOW?

At the OLPH CWL meeting in June our Community Rep brought this information to the attention of our members. Please note that this is not just the CWL members responsibility but all of our responsibility as Catholics. Palliative care is explicitly recognized under the human right to health."

At the 2018 national convention, CWL members passed resolution 2018.03 Legislate Designation of Hospice/Palliative Care Services in Facilities to Exclude Medical Assistance in Dying Legislation. Please take another look at the action Plan for this resolution. ACT!!!

Action Plan



2. Educate members on keeping hospice and palliative care free from medical assistance in dying.

- 3. Where hospices are performing medical assistance in dying, withdraw all funding. Write to the board of directors of hospices stating the reason for the withdrawal of donations.
- 4. Monitor the federal government's response to the request contained in the resolution. \* This action plan is something we ALL can do!

The public needs to understand the practice of palliative care and how it is a viable, life- respecting option for MAiD, which the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) describes as the intentional taking of human life and, as such, is "a grave and morally unjustifiable act." As members of the League one of our Objects of the League is to protect the sanctity of life. MAiD is in direct conflict with our personal moral values and our church's beliefs. We need to bombard the government with our concerns. Pressure to further expand MAiD into more vulnerable populations resulted in Bill C-7 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (medical assistance in dying), receiving royal assent in March 2021. This bill is a historic advance in expanding MAiD criteria and reducing safeguards. Those living with disabilities or mental illness (including emancipated minors) are all now considered candidates for euthanasia, even without a terminal illness. It seems that legislative Acts are being revised to readily and easily allow for more and more persons to use MaiD.

Prayer for the Protection of Human Life

Heavenly Father, Lord and Maker of all that is good, fill our hearts with joy before the wonders of Your creation. Open our eyes to the presence of Your beloved Son Jesus in all those we encounter and especially in the weakest and most vulnerable among us. Where we see life threatened, at its beginning or at its end, or by poverty and deprivation, inspire us with love and mercy, so that, empowered by Your Holy Spirit, we may work together to defend human dignity. Help us to build a culture of life: a culture in which each and every person is loved and valued as Your child, from conception to natural death, and in every circumstance of life. Amen. Mary, Mother of the living, pray for us.
