Gospel Reflection: Matthew 13:24-43 (shorter form: Matthew 13:24-30)

Jesus offers parables about the Kingdom of Heaven and explains them to his disciples.


In today's Gospel, Jesus offers three parables to describe the Kingdom of Heaven. He also explains why he speaks to the crowds in parables and interprets the parable of the sower for the disciples. This reading is a continuation of Jesus' discourse that we began reading last Sunday.

All three parables use commonplace experiences to describe aspects of the Kingdom of Heaven. The first parable is longer and more detailed than the next two, and it alerts us to the two-fold reality of the

Kingdom of Heaven. The beginnings of the Kingdom of Heaven can be found in this world. The fruition of the Kingdom of Heaven, however, will not be realized until the final judgment. In the meantime, as Jesus' explanation to the disciples cautions, any effort to judge the progress of the Kingdom of Heaven is premature. Only God, in the final judgment, will distinguish the fruit of the Kingdom of Heaven and offer its reward.

The second and third parables call to our attention the abundance that will result from the small beginnings of the Kingdom of Heaven. Just as a mustard seed—the smallest of all seeds—will become a large bush, so too God will bring his Kingdom to full bloom. As a small amount of yeast will leaven the entire batch of bread, so too God will bring about the expansion of his Kingdom. In each case the image is of the superabundance that God brings out of even the smallest of signs of the Kingdom.

Contained within these parables are words of caution as well as words of consolation. In the parable of the sower we are warned against judging others. To judge and uproot the "weeds" prematurely will harm the wheat; final judgment rests with God. In the parables of the mustard seed and the yeast, we are consoled by the message that God can work wonders and produce abundance from even the smallest beginnings of the Kingdom of Heaven. \*From Loyolapress.com

#### FIVE COMMON MYTHS ABOUT PRIESTHOOD: A GUIDE FOR PARENTS

Year after year, in surveys of newly ordained priests, over half report that their families opposed the idea of priesthood when they first expressed interest. Undoubtedly, parents want the best for their children. So, what about priesthood does not fit parents' vision of "the good life"? Let's look are five common myths about the seminary and priesthood. This week we will share the second myth.

MYTH #2 "CELIBACY IS IMPOSSIBLE."

For couples who enjoy a healthy sexual relationship, it can be difficult to image their son choosing "life without a wife." Society would have us believe that celibacy is impossible, or at the very least, unreasonable. The truth is that sexual love is indeed one of God's greatest natural gifts, but that thousands of saints have experienced tremen-

dous joy living the supernatural vocation of celibacy. Today's seminaries offer superb formation in how to live celibately with peace and joy.







POSTURE DURING MASS When the priest cleanses his hands during the Preparation of the Gifts—we stand for the prayer: "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.' After the distribution of Holy Communion. There is a period of sacred silence; it should begin as soon as the distribution of Holy Communion has been completed. At this point the faithful may sit or kneel. The faithful should not be required to stand during the purification of vessels, or until the reposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

A bit of history: During Mass, we assume different postures – standing, kneeling, and sitting. These postures are not merely ceremonial. They have profound meaning when done with understanding.

#### **STANDING**

From the earliest days of the church, this posture has been understood as the stance of those who have risen with Christ and seek the things which are above. By baptism we have all been given a fuller share in the life of God and the posture of standing is an acknowledgement of this wonderful gift. Standing is a sign of respect and honour, so we stand as the celebrant who represents Christ, enters and leaves the assembly. We stand when we address God in the various prayers of the Mass; we assume our full stature before God, not in pride, but in humble gratitude for the marvelous things God has done in creating and redeeming each on of us. We stand for the proclamation of the Gospel which recalls the words and deeds of the Lord. The Bishop Fabbro has chosen standing as the normative posture to be observed for the reception of communion.

#### **KNEELING**

In the early Church, kneeling signified penance. So thoroughly

was kneeling identified with penance that the early Christians were forbidden to kneel on Sundays and during the Easter season, when the prevailing spirit of the Liturgy was one of joy and thanksgiving. In the Middle Ages, kneeling came to signify homage, and more recently this posture has come to signify adoration, especially before the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is for this reason that the bishops of this country have chosen the posture of kneeling during the entire Eucharistic Prayer.



#### SITTING

Sitting is the posture of listening and meditation, so the assembly sits for the pre-Gospel readings and the homily and may also sit for the period of mediation following Communion. All should strive to assume a seated posture during the Mass that is attentive rather than merely at rest.







The Holy See has announced the release of a Decree, published by the Apostolic Penitentiary entitled "Decree for the Apostolic Penitentiary on the granting of Plenary Indulgence on the occasion of the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, 05.07.2023." The decree grants a Plenary Indulgence to the faithful who will participate during the solemn celebration that Pope Francis will preside over in St. Peter's Basilica on 23 July 2023, as well as to all those who attendone of the various liturgical celebrations and initiatives, which will be held throughout the world, on the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. The same Plenary Indulgence is extended to those who visit the elderly and sick, as well as those unable to leave their homes, according to the conditions cited within the Decree. OR you can drop off your treasures in the hall on Monday, August 21 to Friday, August 25 from 10 am. to 4:00 pm.


