Gospel Reflection: Matthew 15:21-28

Jesus heals the daughter of the Canaanite woman because of her great faith.



Today we move ahead in our reading of Matthew's Gospel. Last week we read about Jesus walking on the water and the disciples' confession of faith that Jesus is the Son of God. If we were reading Matthew's entire Gospel, we would have read about Jesus' debate with the Pharisees about Jewish purity laws. Jesus argues that it is not what goes into us that makes us unclean; he is referring to the strict Jewish dietary rules. Instead our words and our actions—what comes out of us—make us unclean because they emerge from a heart that is unclean.

Knowing about Jesus' debate with the Pharisees helps us to understand today's Gospel. In fact the story heightens the surprise and shock we feel as we hear Jesus' exchange with the Canaanite woman. The woman, who is not Jewish, approaches Jesus, requesting that he heal her demon-possessed daughter. At first Jesus ignores her; he says nothing. The

disciples ask Jesus to send her away, and Jesus agrees, remarking that he was sent to minister to the Jews alone.

The woman persists, paying homage to Jesus, and yet Jesus denies her request again. He even insults her, using a Jewish word of derision for Gentiles, "dog." But the woman cleverly turns Jesus' insult into an affirmation of faith. Only then does Jesus grant her request and heal her daughter. Jesus' unresponsiveness to this woman may strike us as uncharacteristic or shocking. Yet in Matthew's Gospel, Jesus' ministry is directed primarily to the people of Israel. At only a very few points, such as the one found in today's Gospel, do we find Jesus anticipating the later Christian ministry to the rest of the world.

Behind Matthew's text we can hear this early Christian community's struggle to understand how God's selection of Israel is consistent with two events: Israel's rejection of Jesus and the Gentiles' acceptance of Jesus, Just as Jesus was surprised by the faith expressed by the Canaanite woman, so too the first Christians were surprised that the Gentiles would receive the salvation God offered through Christ. In today's second reading from Paul's letter to the Romans, we hear the apostle Paul considering this same concern.

The faith that the Canaanite woman expresses is an affirmation of and confidence in God's abundant mercy. Yes, salvation comes through Israel, but it overflows for the benefit of all. \*From Loyolapress.com

### THE STORY OF THE QUEENSHIP OF MARY—AUGUST 22

Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954. But the Blessed Virgin Mary's queenship has roots in Scripture. At the Annunciation, Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. At the Visitation, Elizabeth calls Mary "mother of my Lord." As in all the mysteries of Mary's life, she is closely associated with Jesus: Her queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship. We can also recall that in the Old Testament the mother of the king has great influence in court. In the fourth century Saint Ephrem called Mary "Lady" and "Queen." Later Church fathers and doctors continued to use the

title. Hymns of the 11th to 13th centuries address Mary as queen: "Hail, Holy Queen," "Hail, Queen of Heaven," "Queen of Heaven." The Dominican rosary and the Franciscan crown as well as numerous invocations in Mary's litany celebrate her queenship.

The feast is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is now celebrated on the octave day of that feast. In his 1954 encyclical To the Queen of Heaven, Pius XII points out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power.

#### Reflection

As Saint Paul suggests in Romans 8:28–30, God has predestined human beings from all eternity to share the image of his Son. All the more was Mary predestined to be the mother of Jesus. As Jesus was to be king of all creation, Mary, in dependence on Jesus, was to be queen. All other titles to queenship derive from this eternal intention of God. As Jesus exercised his kingship on earth by serving his Father and his I fellow human beings, so did Mary exercise her queenship. As the glorified Jesus remains with us as our king till the end of time (Matthew 28:20), so does Mary, who was assumed into heaven and crowned queen of heaven and earth. \*https://www.franciscanmedia.org/saint-of-the-| day/queenship-of-the-blessed-virgin-mary/







#### FEED YOU SOUL: FIND GOD'S DETOUR SIGN WITH ALLEN HUNT

It's a tiny little word. It shows up two times in this gospel reading today, verse 23, and verse 25. But there it is, B-U-T, but. Every time I think about, but, in the Bible, I think about Joseph in the book of Genesis. Because, like the Canaanite woman whose daughter is possessed by a demon in

But

this gospel today, Joseph understood the power of that one little word, B-U-T. Joseph was a devout dreamer with his coat of many colors, and at the tender age of 17, he'd been assured by God through dreams that he would one day be a ruler, and his older brothers would be subject to him. God's dream was clear. Joseph was foolish enough to share that dream with his brothers. And they hated him for it. They resented him further because he was their father, Jacob's favorite. So one day out in the fields, they decide to kill Joseph, but the oldest brother Rubin prevented the murder, and they sold him instead to a camel caravan of traders heading toward Egypt.

Imagine yourself as Joseph, your hands tied behind you, transported as a hostage to uncaring strangers toward a foreign land, your status plunged from favorite son and future ruler to a slave worth 20 shekels. Less than a camel's value. Where is God in this dream? Sounds more like a nightmare. But Joseph knew that two of the best words in the Bible are but God. That pairing occurs at least 42 times in scripture. Words that mean that God is about to do something. Maybe going this way, but God, regardless of appearances, things may be going one way, and God is about to intervene. But God, David's in the wilderness, Saul's in hot dispute, searching to kill David. But God didn't give David into his hands. The Israelites are fleeing the Egyptian army, and pharaoh, not knowing how to escape. But God led the people around by the desert road through the Red Sea. But God, it's a reminder that God protects, God delivers, God intervenes, God saves.

So I invite you today as you read this Gospel and you think about Joseph as well, learn those two words-- but God. They work in every situation-- when you're alone, when you're laundering, when you're struggling, when you're tired, when you're accused, when you're teetering-- but God.

There will be times when you want to give up. In those moments -in those very moments- turn to God. I mean, really [laughter], where else will you go? Don't give up. He will help turn what could make you bitter into something that will make you better because there truly are no more beautiful words than but God.


