Gospel Reflection: Matthew 22:15-21

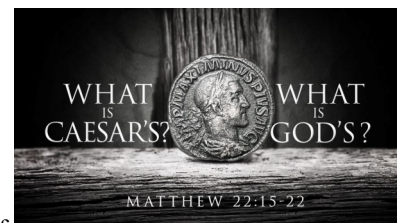
The Pharisees send their disciples to test Jesus with a question about taxes.

In today's Gospel Jesus and the religious leaders in Jerusalem continue their tense exchange of questions and challenges. At this point the disciples of the Pharisees, together with the Herodians, try to entrap Jesus by their question about the payment of taxes. Matthew sets up an unusual partnership between the Pharisees and the Herodians. The Herodians were supporters of Herod Antipas, a Jewish political leader who collaborated with the Romans. Such collaboration would have required a compromised observance of the Mosaic Law. The Pharisees, on the other hand, taught scrupulous observance of the Mosaic Law and opposed Roman occupation. Herodians favored the payment of taxes; the Pharisees opposed it. The Herodians and the Pharisees approach Jesus, asking that he take sides in their dispute. If Jesus answers with the Pharisees, he shows himself to be an enemy of Rome. If he answers with the Herodians, he offends popular Jewish religious sensibilities.

Jesus' response to this attempt to trap him exposes the guile of his questioners. From his first words to them, Jesus shows that he is very much aware of what they are trying to do. He asks to see a Roman coin, which is readily provided to him. It may have come from the hand of a Herodian, but the Pharisees show themselves to be quite willing to accept this compromise. Jesus has already exposed the Pharisees as hypocrites.

Jesus takes his response one step further. He asks that his questioners examine the coin. Agreeing that it is Caesar's image on the coin, Jesus tells them that it must belong to Caesar. Avoiding the question of lawfulness altogether, Jesus answers their question with simple logic. Then, going further still, Jesus tells them that their obligation is to pay to God that which belongs to God.

Jesus' response to the Herodians and Pharisees suggests the ethic that Christians ought to adopt. It reminds us of the importance of keeping things in their proper perspective. Do we attach ourselves to worldly things at the expense of the love and honor that we owe to God? **From Loyolapress.com*

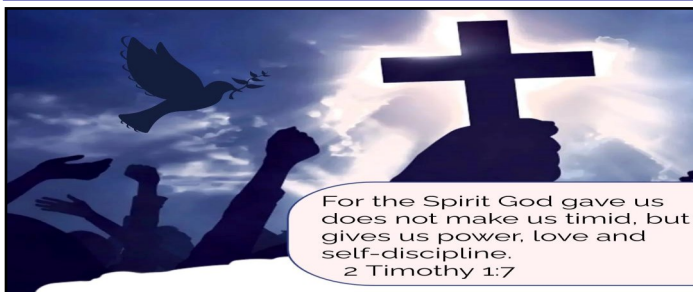

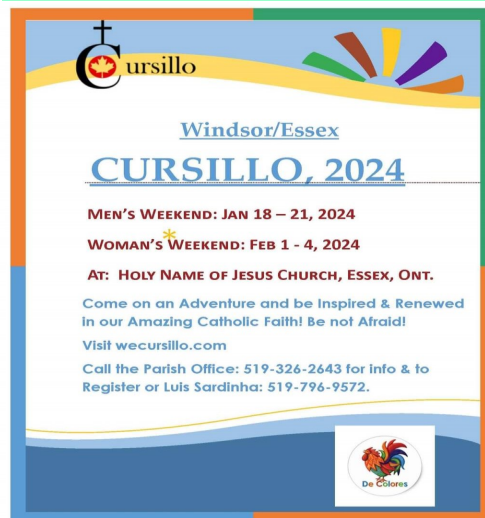
WORLD MISSION SUNDAY—OCTOBER 22

"Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God" (cf. Mt 22:21) This Sunday, which is World Mission Day, has the following theme: "Hearts on fire, feet on the move" (Lk 24:13-35).

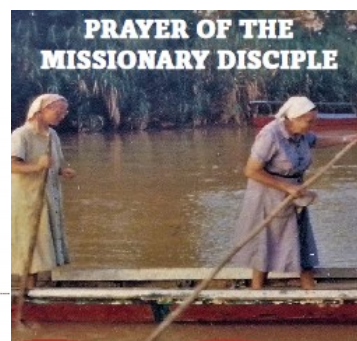
Pope Francis is amazed by the eternal youth of a Church that is always going forth. In his message, he says: "The image of 'feet setting out' reminds us once more of the perennial validity of the missio ad gentes, the mission entrusted to the Church by the risen Lord to evangelize all individuals and peoples, even to the ends of the earth. Today more than ever, our human family, wounded by so many situations of injustice, so many divisions and wars, is in need of the Good News of peace and salvation in Christ." 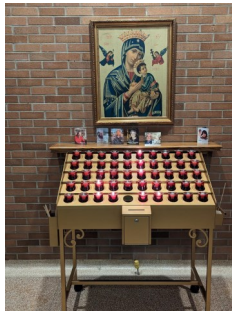
NEW CANDLE STAND AT OLPH CHURCH

In October of 2021 we purchased a St. Killians candle stand. The safest, cleanest, smokeless candle burning system in the world. Due to COVID and the factory shutting down that was manufacturing the candle stands our order was put on hold. After many, many phone calls and emails we were finally told in 2022 that production had resumed. We continued to keep communications open with our supplier in Oshawa. Then by the grace of God we were informed that the candle stand was indeed ready to be shipped and delivered to us. It arrived on Monday. This candle stand is approved by our insurance company. The St. Killians candle is placed into the internal glass, which contains a small hole at the base. The candle liquifies as it burns, until it reaches the base of the glass. The candle burns for approximately 90 minutes—2 hrs. As the base of the candle liquifies it draws the wick down, thus extinguishing itself before leaving the glass through the hole in the base. The remaining wax drops through into a tray of water, which is contained inside the candle rack. Upon reaching the water tray the wax hardens and is easily removed. A suggested donation of \$2.00 would be appreciated.

We hope the candle stand will be appreciated and used by our parish community.

We thank Christine—as she was persistent & patient in making sure that we had a candle stand here at OLPH Church.

We also would like to thank our dedicated bingo volunteers for covering our sessions at All Star Gaming Centre on Walker Rd. The candle stand purchase was covered by the funds from those sessions.

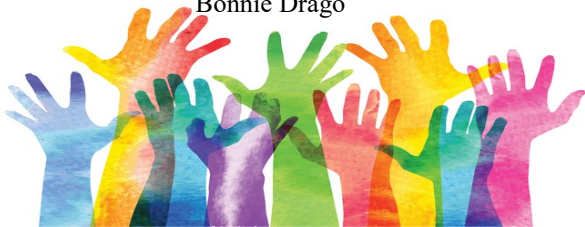
