**Pope's Prayer Intentions for July:** For formation in discernment: Let us pray that we might again learn how to discern, to know how to choose paths of life and reject everything that leads us away from Christ and the Gospel.

#### Gospel Background: Luke 10:1-12,17-20

Jesus sends out 72 people to announce the coming kingdom.

Today's Gospel begins immediately after the final verse in last Sunday's Gospel. After strong language about the difficulties of discipleship, Jesus immediately appoints 72 people to go ahead of him to every town and place he plans to visit, proclaiming that the Kingdom of God is at hand. He sends them in pairs. In the Law of Moses two witnesses were needed for a testimony to be credible. It was probably also a safer way to travel.

Jesus admits it will be difficult, that he is sending them out like lambs among wolves. Yet they are to bring nothing with them, not even a money bag or sandals. They are to greet no one on the way so as not to be distracted from their mission. When they enter a house, their message is simply "peace." The response they will receive may be positive or negative. Either way, they are to know that the Kingdom of God is at hand. They are not to demand special treatment but eat and drink whatever is given them. They are to stay in one house and are not to look around for one that provides better accommodations. They are to heal the sick as a sign that the Kingdom of God is at hand for them. Like Jesus' miracles, healing

is a sign of the coming of the kingdom. If the town will not receive them, they are to shake the dust from their feet and move on. Even in the case of such rejection they should know that the Kingdom of God is at hand. When they return from



their journeys, they are rejoicing because their mission has been successful. Demons were under their power because of Jesus' name. Jesus may have sent them out as lambs among wolves, but at the conclusion of this passage he assures them that they have been given power over the enemy and nothing will harm them, not even serpents and scorpions. A key theme of today's Gospel and last Sunday's Gospel is disciple-ship—its challenges, its difficulties, and its rewards. Sharing in the mission of Jesus is difficult, but everyone is called to do it, not just some professionals trained for ministry. Even for us today, the harvest is plentiful. We should pray to the master of the harvest to send out workers for his harvest. \* From Loyolapress.com

#### 1700TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE COUNCIL OF NICEA: EMBRACING THE NICENE CREED

The Jubilee Year of 2025 marks the 1700th anniversary of the Nicene Creed. It was drawn up by the bishops and theologians who gathered at the first Ecumenical Council in Nicaea (modern-day Turkey) in 325 to settle a dispute about Jesus, since some were saying that he was only a special human being but not God. At the Council it was declared that Jesus is consubstantial with the Father. The next Ecumenical Council, held at Constantinople in 381, would add to the Creed and make it clear that the Holy Spirit is also God, of the same substance. This expanded Creed came to be known as the "Nicene Creed".

To mark this 1700-year milestone since the first Ecumenical Council, Bishop Fabbro has asked that we pray the Nicene Creed at more celebrations of Mass during the Jubilee Year.

Our Family of Parishes we will pray the Nicene Creed for the remainder of this Jubilee year.

In our parishes, we will make the Nicene Creed available on the screen at OLPH, also the Nicene Creed can be found in the red Celebrate in Song hymnals and in the Living With Christ Sunday Missals.

The Jubilee year offers the faithful an opportunity to obtain Plenary Indulgences. Indulgences can be obtained by pilgrimages, pious visits to sacred places, and works of mercy and penance.

The Jubilee Indulgence is a plenary indulgence that, thanks to the power of prayer, is intended in a particular



way for those who have gone before us, so that they may obtain full mercy. It may also be sought for oneself. It is a way of discovering the unlimited nature of God's mercy. During a Jubilee Year, which normally happens every 25 years, all other

indulgences previously granted remain in force and may be obtained by the faithful.


The Jubilee Indulgence is obtained in the same manner as any plenary indulgence. One who is truly repentant and free from any attachment to or desire for sin, moved by a spirit of charity, must perform a prescribed act to be able to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence. The person must also go to Confession (within several days before or after the prescribed act), receive Holy Communion and pray for the intentions of the Pope (specifically praying 1 Our Father and 1 Hail Mary). The Jubilee Indulgence may be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory, being the most commendable act of mercy itself.
