Pope's Prayer Intentions for April: For priests in crisis;

Let us pray for priests going through moments of crisis in their vocation, that they may find the accompaniment they need and that communities may support them with understanding and prayer.

Gospel Background—John 20:19-31

Thomas believes because he sees Jesus. The Gospels tell us that Jesus appeared to the disciples on several occasions after they discovered that his tomb was empty. Part of the mystery of Jesus' Resurrection is that he appeared to his disciples not as a spirit but in bodily form. The bodily form was not one that the disciples recognized though. In John's Gospel, Mary of Magdala does not recognize that the figure standing before her is Jesus until he speaks to her. In Luke's Gospel the disciples who meet Jesus on the road to Emmaus do not recognize him until he breaks bread with them. The resurrected Jesus had a physical presence, but the disciples couldn't recognize Jesus unless he allowed them to. His resurrected body, nonetheless, showed the marks of his crucifixion.

From readings such as today's Gospel, we also see that in his resurrected body, Jesus seems to be free of physical constraints. He appears to the disciples despite the fact that the doors were locked. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. In doing so, Jesus commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." During the meeting, Jesus also shows the integral connection between forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The story of Thomas illustrates our Christian experience today: We are called to believe without seeing. In fact, all Christians after the first witnesses have been called to believe without seeing. Thomas's doubt is hardly surprising; the news of Jesus' appearance was incredible to the disciples who had seen him crucified and buried. Thomas's human nature compelled him to want hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death was indeed the same Jesus who had been crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to act on that desire. He is our witness that Jesus is really risen.

Our faith is based on the witness of the Church that has preceded us, beginning with Thomas and the first disciples. Through Baptism we receive the same Holy Spirit that Jesus brought to the first disciples. DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY—CELEBRATING GOD'S MERCIFUL LOVE

In the Jubilee Year 2000, Pope John Paul II proclaimed that from that year forward the Second Sunday of Easter would be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday. This was proclaimed at the Canonization Mass of St. Faustina Kawalska, who worked throughout her life to make all aware of the merciful love of God. St. Faustina (1905–1938) was born and raised in Poland. Following a vocation to religious life, she was accepted by the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. As a member of the Congregation, she worked as a cook, gardener, and porter. In her spiritual life, her contemplation on the Mercy of God led her to develop a childlike trust in God and deep love for her neighbor. In her years in the convent, St. Faustina heard a call from God to make God's mercy known to the world so that the world may more fully receive God's healing grace. St. Faustina promoted the Chaplet of Divine Mercy which consists of the recitation of prayers to the Eternal Father with the use of the rosary for the sake of Christ's sorrowful passion.

The Chaplet is prayed as follows:

- 1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross, one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and the Apostles' Creed.**
- 2. On the Our Father beads, recite the following: "Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."**
- 3. On the ten Hail Mary beads, say the following: "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."**
- 4. Repeat step two and three for all five decades.**
- 5. Conclude by reciting three times: "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One,**

DIOCESAN PASTORAL COUNCIL

In 2022, Bishop Fabbro re-established the Diocesan Pastoral Council. It is a consultative body made up of mostly Lay Faithful and representatives of the Religious in the Diocese as well as deacons and priests. They act as an advisory council for the Bishop. The members of the Council identify pastoral needs, and with study, prayer, discernment, and dialogue, they present possible recommendations for the Bishop to consider. With the term of office ending for some current members, we are seeking new members, one representative from each deanery, who will be appointed to the Council and will join in September 2026. In the coming months, the Diocese will host a series of recruitment meetings for those who may be interested in joining the Council. Please prayerfully consider attending one of the following meetings to get more information and how to submit your name (or another person) for consideration. Please keep this initiative in your prayers as the Church continues to respond to Pope Leo's first words from the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, "We must seek together how to be a missionary Church." He reminds us to carry forward his predecessor's hallmark initiative, to engage each other in synodality, and to give a more prominent voice to the laity in future pastoral directions for our Diocese. Dates for the meetings are scheduled to be held in the evening in each deanery.

Our deanery meeting is on April 14, 2026, at Most Precious Blood, Windsor. The meeting starts at 7pm.

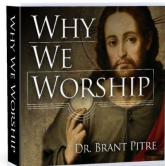

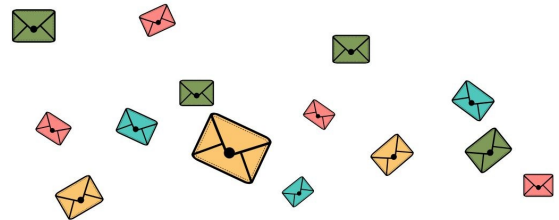

The Essence of Divine Mercy Devotion is to TRUST in His mercy and to BE MERCIFUL to others. "I desire that there be a Feast of Mercy. I want this image to be solemnly blessed on the second Sunday of Easter; that Sunday is to be the Feast of Mercy." (Diary, 49) "The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls." (Diary, 299) The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. (Diary, 699)



YOUTH FUNDRAISER- THE "MONEY WALL"

During the Easter season we be having an envelope



fundraiser for youth events. The money raised will help cover any extra cost above and beyond what the K of C provide at some of our events. **We host several FREE family events over the year.** We also provide snacks and juice at our Confirmation preparation classes and provide a Christian treat (toy or game) to the First Reconciliation & Communion children at their preparation classes.

The method is simple: We will have a wall of numbered envelopes on the bulletin boards at St. Michael & Our Lady of Perpetual Help. Donors can select an envelope and donate the money listed on the envelope. For example, envelopes will be labeled from \$1.00 - \$100.00- someone can then choose the envelope numbered 17 and would then donate \$17 into that envelope. The instructions are to put the appropriate amount of cash or check into the envelope, fill out the form included inside the envelope, seal it and put it in the collection basket.

TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION - 'DID YOU KNOW'

Did you know this year marks the 150th anniversary of the Indian Act. The Indian Act was established on April 12, 1876. It defined who was and who was not an "Indian." An Indian agent was on or near reserves to enforce the Act and dictate daily living, such as permission to leave the reserve, participating in ceremonies and pow-wows, etc. It was the foundation for Canada's assimilation policy towards First Nations, Métis and Inuit. If you want to learn more about the Indian Act and myths surrounding it check out the book 21 Things You May Not Know About the Indian Act by Bob Joseph.
