Pope's Prayer Intentions for May: That everyone might have food: Let us pray that everyone, from large producers to small consumers, be committed to avoid wasting food, and to ensure that everyone has access to quality food.



In the Catholic tradition, May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, a custom that honors her as the Mother of God and Mother of the Church. This month-long devotion, which often includes crowning her statues with flowers and praying the Rosary, highlights her role in salvation history and welcomes the spring season as a symbol of new life.

Gospel Background— John 14:1–12

Jesus tells his disciples, "I am the way and the truth and the life."

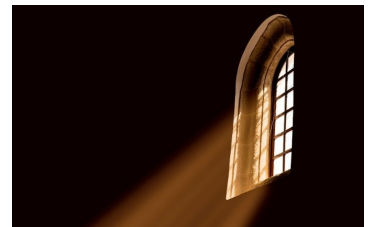
The readings for the last few Sundays have been about the Resurrection, but today's Gospel takes us back in time to an event in Jesus' life before his Passion. Jesus tells his disciples that he is going to prepare a place for them in his Father's house. He promises that where he is going, his disciples will be able to follow. Thomas, who will later doubt the disciples' reports that they have seen the Risen Lord, contradicts Jesus by saying that the disciples don't know where Jesus is going or how to get there. Jesus explains that he himself is the way, the truth, and the life. In knowing and loving Jesus, the disciples now love God the Father.

Philip then makes a request that challenges Jesus' words. Philip wants Jesus to show the Father to the disciples. Recall that Jesus has just told his disciples, "If you know me, then you will also know my Father.

From now on you do know him and have seen him." As a good teacher, Jesus responds to Philip by repeating and elaborating on what he has just told the disciples: they have seen and known Jesus, so they have seen and known the Father. Then Jesus offers another reassurance about his departure: because of faith in God and in Jesus, the disciples will do the work that Jesus has done and more.

The connection between Jesus and his Father, between Jesus' work and the work of the Father, is made clear in today's Gospel. Jesus is in the Father, and God the Father is in Jesus. As God spoke his name to Moses, "I am," so too Jesus speaks his name to his disciples: "I am the way and the truth and the life."

The revelation of the Trinity is completed in the passage that follows today's reading, and it is the Gospel for next Sunday. Because Jesus goes away, the Father will send in Jesus' name the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who will continue the work of the Father and of Jesus. * *from <https://www.loyolapress.com/catholic-resources/liturgical-year/sunday-connection/>*

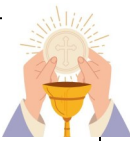

Did you know that **May 5th is the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls** also known as Red Dress Day? The REDress project began in 2010 when Metis artist Jaime Black hung hundreds of empty, red dresses to represent the missing and murdered women and girls of Canada. According to Stats Canada, Indigenous women and girls are six times more likely to be murdered than other groups of people in Canada. TRC Call to Action #41 addresses the issue of disproportionate violence towards Indigenous women and girls and calls for a public inquiry which released a final report in 2019 with 231 calls for justice.

“Who’s Who?” in Confirmation: Explaining the Roles

It takes a whole church to raise a disciple. Each time young people are confirmed, they take their place in the wider community of faith among those who have played a vital role in helping them reach this sacramental milestone. This sacramental team includes a number of people:

The Candidate: Expect great things from this process, and let your prayers reflect that you are trusting God to work through this program so that you—the candidates who are Catholic “because I was raised that way” will become Catholic “because Jesus is the way, and I can’t trust another; because Jesus is the truth, and I’m convinced; and because Jesus is the life, and I can’t imagine life without him.”

The Candidate’s Family: Parents are not only the primary educators of their children; they are also the “first heralds of the Gospel.” Parents provide a child’s first glimpse of the unconditional love at the heart of the Gospel. They are also the first people to show their children, by example, what it means to be a disciple of the Lord. For better or for worse, a teen’s faith tends to mimic that of his or her mother and father.

The Sponsor: Like a parent, a Confirmation sponsor’s job is to be an up-close-and-personal witness of the Christian life for the candidate. The sponsor’s task does not end when the teen is confirmed. Rather, the sponsor is obligated to help the teen grow in faith, to help with his or her Christian walk throughout life, and to seek out the candidate if he or she ever goes astray.

The catechists: Catechist should be more like a big brother or sister sharing life in Christ than a distant instructor sharing facts about God. While a catechist will spend most of his or her time leading the group, it is equally important to listen and remain patient, to demand respect, to give an example of what holiness means, and to take questions seriously. Even if you do not have answers immediately, let them know that you will find them.

The Parish Community: to show their loving support. It is amazing what a little encouragement and kindness from the pulpit and the pews can do. Their main support is through their prayers for the Confirmation candidates.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help CWL BURSARIES

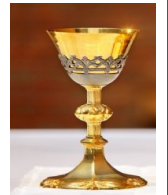

RETURN OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD

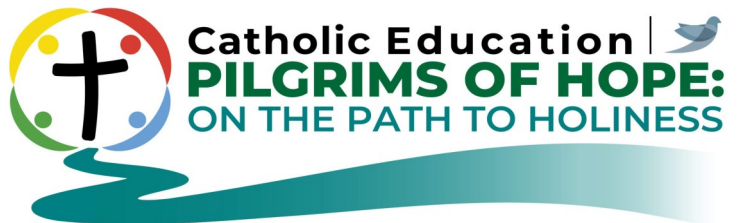

CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK BEGINS ON SUNDAY, MAY 3, 2026.

The Catholic elementary schools—St. Angela, St. Christopher & Our Lady of Perpetual Help and our High school—Catholic Central in our Family of Parishes will engage in a series of events to celebrate the ongoing gift of publicly funded Catholic education. You are invited to learn about the various celebrations that are happening in your children’s school, and are welcome to attend, if possible. Publicly funded Catholic education has existed in Ontario since 1841 and its graduates have served Ontario and Canada very well. The current generation of students in our publicly funded Catholic schools will serve with the same spirit and generosity as their previous generations. This year’s Catholic Education theme is, “Pilgrims of Hope: On the Path to Holiness.”

In light of the canonization of Blessed Carlos Acutis, the Catholic Education Week theme will focus on the Pastoral Letter to Young People issued by the Bishops of Canada in October 2022. As young people themselves, their example shows us, very vividly, what it means to live as pilgrims on a journey of faith, toward a hope grounded in the unshakeable love of the Risen Jesus. Our lives as Christians are truly a path toward holiness – becoming, more and more, the people God created us to be. That will look different in each of our lives, but for all of us, we know that it is God’s Spirit at work in us who guides us toward holiness: “The Holy Spirit illumines all believers with the light of hope. He keeps that light burning, like an ever-burning lamp, to sustain and invigorate our lives.” (Spes Non Confundit, 3)

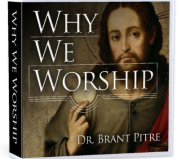
