# 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time - July 27, 2025 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time - August 3, 2025

In the Gospel, the disciples ask Jesus, "Lord, teach us to pray." This is a very important and humble request - it flows from the heart of a disciple who sees that Jesus' prayer is something deep, real, powerful, and filled with closeness to the Father. The disciples don't want to just learn how to pray properly - they want to pray as Jesus does.

Christ's answer is the "Our Father" - not merely a readymade formula, but a way of life. Jesus invites us to stand before God not as slaves or beggars, but as children who have the courage to say: "Father!" This prayer teaches us these things: to recognize God's holiness and His reign - "hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come"; to entrust our daily needs to Him - "give us this day our daily bread"; to forgive and to ask for forgiveness - "forgive us... as we forgive..."; and to trust Him in times of trial - "lead us not

into temptation."

Jesus also encourages perseverance in prayer. He tells a story about a man who knocks at his friend's door at night asking for bread – and he receives what he needs, not only because of friendship, but because of his persistence.

God is not a tired neighbor that we have to persuade or pressure into listening to us. He is a loving Father, who wants to give good things to His children. Jesus says: "If you then... know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!"

That's the key: prayer is not just about asking for things. It's about opening ourselves to the Holy Spirit Himself - the One who transforms us and helps us truly live as children of God.
