The Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus foretell the reward after death for all our good and evil deeds. The rich man is not mentioned by name. This means that he virtually does not exist - he disappears into the depths of the Abyss - because his wicked life is not worth remembering. The poor man, however, is given a specific name; therefore, he truly exists and will never be forgotten before God.

Another message of this parable is the mention of the chasm that yawns between the abyss and heaven. This signifies that after death a person will no longer be able to change anything in their life, to reevaluate values, or

to pass from one state to another. The time for that is only during earthly life, here and now.

A further idea is the firmly expressed truth that no one will receive a sign from the afterlife calling them to change their way of life. No deceased person will come to frighten them into conversion. The truth is clear: man has "Moses and the Prophets," that is, God's Revelation contained in Scripture and Tradition. There God has spoken everything necessary for our conversion and the attainment of eternal life. "If they do not listen to this, neither will they be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead." (Fr. W.M.)
