Dear Parishioners,

A special thanks to all who made Together in Mission commitments this past weekend. We are grateful to have had the presence and good words of Father Parker Sandoval from Resurrection Church in Boyle Heights. Today we are engaging in Together in Mission follow up weekend for those who were not here this past weekend. Thanks for your patience, your support and your prayers for this crucial endeavor in our archdiocese.



Ash Wednesday is THIS WEDNESDAY!! Although it is NOT a holy day of obligation, it's a great way to get a jump on Lent by participating in the holy Mass and receiving ashes as a sign of our turning away from sin and returning to the Gospel. Ashes are distributed at each of the Masses this day. Masses will be at 6:30 AM, 8 AM, 10 AM (Schools), 12:15 PM, 5:30 PM and 7:00 PM (in Spanish).

Please note: there will be no OLPH novena in the church this Wednesday night due to the Ash Wednesday celebrations. Have you thought in advance about what you might work on during this Lenten season? Fasting from gossip? Fasting from getting so caught up in ourselves? Extra prayer for your priests. (We need those!!) Extra generosity to the church and to the poor? Making sure that you attend the Lenten Mission coming up?

We are back to Friday Stations of the Cross. Stations are offered at 6 PM (English) and then again at 7 PM (Spanish). We are having Fish Fridays every Friday in place of the old Lenten Soup Suppers. (We will still have soup (from Foxy's) and bread (from Porto's), in addition to the fish dinner.) Fish Fridays take place from 6 PM – 7:30 PM.

Remember the parish mission is coming up March 13 – 15 with Father Augustino Torres, C.F.R. He comes from the Bronx. "No pain, no gain: the cost of discipleship" is the theme. Come and get fired up in your relationship with Jesus.

[Continued from William E. Simon, Jr.'s "Waking Up From Spiritual Sleepwalking."] "We believe that millions can move from spiritual quiescence to a life rich in prayer, Bible study, philanthropy and simple kindness. I estimate we could at least double levels of engagement at churches. ... Holy Family Parish in Inverness, Ill., has 'small groups' of about 15 people who gather regularly to pray, eat, and discuss Scripture. Father Terence Keehan said that Holy Family has 4,200 registered families, and these groups offer the intimacy that people at large parishes crave. ... Ambitious mission trips can be another way to encourage long-term spiritual growth, especially when parishioners work together to serve others. Father Tony Zimmer of St. Anthony on the Lake in Pewaukee, Wis., described how his parishioners bonded by building a hospice, a school and an orphanage in Peru." [to be continued]

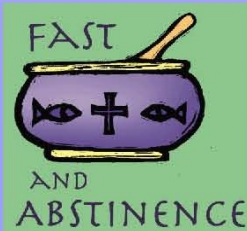

ASH WEDNESDAY

ASH WEDNESDAY—March 1

This is not a Holy Day of Obligation, but a tradition in the church to start our sacred journey of Lent. Ashes are distributed at daily Mass at 6:30 am, 8:00 am, 10:00 am (School Mass), 12:15 pm, 5:30 pm and 7:00 pm (Spanish).

Ash Wednesday, a day of fasting and prayer, is the first day of Lent. It occurs exactly 46 days before Easter (40 days not counting Sundays). Ashes are ceremonially placed on the heads of Christians while they may hear "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."



The Law of Fasting allows only one full meal and two lighter meals in the course of a day and prohibits eating between meals. Traditionally, fasting is one

of the foremost ways in which we can share in the sufferings of Christ through self-denial. Although everyone is encouraged to practice some kind of fasting during Lent, people between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on the mandatory days of fasting: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Pregnant women, sick people and people who are older are not obliged to fast. Abstinence forbids the eating of meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent, especially Good Friday. All people from 14 years and older are bound to obey the law of abstinence.

RECONCILIATION

Make a good confession during Lent. If you have not done so in a while, come to Holy Family and feel welcome! We have compassionate priests! Confessions are at 4:30-5:15pm on Mondays (except April 10) and Thursdays, and Saturdays at 4:00-5:00pm. We will have a penance service on Tuesday, April 11, 7:00pm-8:30pm.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Attend this long-time devotion. It is every Friday during Lent right after the 5:30 pm Mass (approximately 6:00 pm) and then at 7:00 pm in Spanish.

Stations of the Cross help us to make a spiritual Pilgrimage through the contemplation of the Passion of Christ. We adore you O Christ and we bless you.

During Lent, we are asked to abstain from eating meat on Fridays. We are also asked to consider giving up something as a sacrifice. Consider giving up your time to do something to help others or to help yourself become closer to God. Maybe you can attend daily Mass some days in addition to your Sunday obligation or visit the Adoration Chapel. Perhaps you could do a daily Lenten prayer and reflection. There are many books and pamphlets available in bookstores or online. Consider Matthew Kelly's free on line e-mail program designed to help you have a life-changing Lent. Sign up at – BestLentEver.com. You will get a daily e mail with a short video and reflection.

Consider attending the **Chrism Mass** at Our Lady of the Angels Cathedral. This is when all the holy oils are blessed for all the churches by the Archbishop. This is Monday, April 10 at 7:00pm. **Our penance service** is on Tuesday, April 11 at 7:00pm. Consider going to Mass on **Holy Thursday**, April 13 at 7:30pm. This Mass honors the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. **Good Friday** is April 14. Experience our live stations of the cross at 12:00pm presented by our Teens in the parish, and followed by the presentation of the seven last words, liturgy service and the procession of the dead Christ. Saturday, April 15 at 7:30pm is the biggest liturgy of the year: the **Easter Vigil**, this is when we welcome the newly baptized and confirmed into the church.

Easter Sunday is April 16. Regular Mass times, except there is no 5:30pm Mass.
