ADMINISTRATOR'S CORNER



Dear Parishioners,

The first reading and the Gospel for this Sunday relate stories of faith and gratitude. They are often used as readings for Thanksgiving Day. The second Monday in October is still designated as the federal holiday for Columbus Day, though the State of California and several other States have long ceased honoring Christopher Columbus and his voyage to the New World. When I was a child, I recall that we had a day off from school and that the original Columbus Day was October 12. In those days, there was a rhyme that many children memorized to recall the year in which Columbus and the first Europeans landed in the Americas: "In fourteen hundred ninety-two, Columbus sailed the ocean blue." I learned that Christopher Columbus was an Italian who was employed by the two Spanish monarchs, King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella, to lead the voyage across the ocean in hopes of discovering a shortcut to India and the other lands of the East, to open opportunities for trade, for wealth to flow into Europe. His accidental landing in the Americas was the beginning of European contact with the indigenous peoples of the New World, the exploration and settlement of the lands by Europeans, and the eventual founding of the various nations of the Americas, including the United States. In those days, Columbus Day was not just the beginning of the various end-of-year sales in department stores, but a kind of patriotic day, not as significant to the nation's history as the Fourth of July, but a day that was meant to celebrate the "discovery" of the Americas, the planting of the seeds that developed into the United States, and the contributions of Americans of Italian and Iberian descent. In some sense, Christopher Columbus symbolized the "American spirit" of adventure and boldness in pursuit of one's dreams.

It was only in the university that I encountered another side to the story. During my first year, at the beginning of October 1992, I saw posters on walls and on bulletin boards all around the campus with an image of Columbus and the word "WANTED" in capital letters above his head, in the same style as the posters used to track and capture criminals. The crime of Christopher Columbus? "500 years of genocide" was what the poster said. I thought at first that the posters were some kind of joke or prank, but then I discovered that many students and professors truly believed that Columbus was a mass murderer, and demanded that the university administrators remove his holiday from the calendar. Some people said, "Only university students are foolish enough to protest a day off from work." But it succeeded and the Columbus Day holiday was removed from the university's calendar.

Christopher Columbus was no saint, particularly in his later years as governor of the lands that were placed under his control by the Spanish Crown. Atrocities against the indigenous peoples occurred under his governorship, whether or not he ordered or agreed with them, and his reputation has suffered greatly as a result. But it is not for these actions that Columbus was honored. Rather, if we take time to read his writings and those of the historians of his time, to understand his intentions for undertaking the voyage, to get some sense of why he risked everything to sail into unknown waters, we can discover that Columbus was motivated not only by desire for wealth or power or fame (which form part of the story), but also deeply motivated by faith.

Christopher Columbus was a friend of the Franciscan friars and a member of the Third Order of St Francis. When he was discouraged by lack of initial support for his voyage, the friars encouraged his dream and secured contacts for him in the Royal Court to gain the support of Ferdinand and Isabella. Columbus stayed in a Franciscan friary as he prepared for his first voyage, and celebrated with them the Franciscan feast of Our Lady of the Angels on the day before his departure. He entrusted the success of the voyage to the Blessed Virgin, prayed the Liturgy of the Hours daily, and directed the sailors to sing the Salve Regina with him at each sunset. They sighted and first set foot on land on the feast of Our Lady of the Pillar (Oct 12). Kneeling in prayer, Columbus gave thanks to God for permitting him to carry the message of salvation to this part of the world. On his second voyage, he invited five priests (including three Franciscans) to accompany him as the first missionaries to the peoples of the Americas. This was the beginning of the most phenomenal spread of the Catholic Faith since the time of Saint Paul. As I mentioned at the beginning, the Scriptures today offer us stories of faith and gratitude. I venture to say, even with our many imperfections, the Holy Spirit continues to inspire throughout our human history new stories of faith and gratitude, if we have our heart and eyes open to see them and to take up our role in the stories unfolding now.

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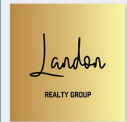
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MINISTERIO HISPANO

Queridos feligreses,

La primera lectura y el Evangelio de este domingo relatan historias de fe y gratitud. A menudo se utilizan como lecturas para el Día de Acción de Gracias. El segundo lunes de octubre todavía se designa como feriado federal para el Día de Cristóbal Colón, aunque el estado de California y varios otros estados han dejado de honrar a Cristóbal Colón y su viaje al Nuevo Mundo. Cuando era niño, recuerdo que teníamos un día libre en la escuela y que el Día de Colón originalmente era el 12 de octubre. En esos días, había una rima que muchos niños memorizaron para recordar el año en que desembarcaron Colón y los primeros europeos en las Américas: "En mil cuatrocientos noventa y dos, Colón navegó el océano azul". (Desafortunadamente, no rima en español). Aprendí que Cristóbal Colón era un italiano que fue contratado por los dos monarcas españoles, el rey Fernando y la reina Isabel, para guiar el viaje a través del océano con la esperanza de descubrir un atajo a la India y otras tierras del Este, para abrir oportunidades para el comercio, para que la riqueza fluya hacia Europa. Su aterrizaje accidental en las Américas fue el comienzo del contacto europeo con los pueblos indígenas del Nuevo Mundo, la exploración y la colonización de las tierras por parte de los europeos y la eventual fundación de las diversas naciones de las Américas, incluido Estados Unidos. En aquellos días, el Día de Colón no era solo el comienzo de las ventas de fin de año en los centros comerciales, sino un tipo de día patriótico, no tan significativo para la historia de la nación como el 4 de julio, pero un día que estaba destinado para celebrar el "descubrimiento" de las Américas, la plantación de las semillas que se desarrollaron en los Estados Unidos, y las contribuciones de los estadounidenses de ascendencia italiana e ibérica. En cierto sentido, Cristóbal Colón simbolizó el "espíritu americano" de aventura y audacia en la búsqueda de los sueños.



Fue solo en la universidad que encontré otro lado de la historia. Durante mi primer año, a principios de octubre de 1992, vi carteles en las paredes y en los tabloncillos de anuncios de todo el campus universitario con una imagen de Colón y las palabras "SE BUSCA" en mayúsculas sobre su cabeza, en el mismo estilo que los carteles utilizados para rastrear y capturar a los bandidos. ¿El crimen de Cristóbal Colón? "500 años de genocidio" decía el cartel. Al principio pensé que los carteles eran una especie de broma, pero luego descubrí que muchos estudiantes y profesores realmente creían que Colón era un asesino en masa y exigieron que los administradores de la universidad eliminaran el feriado del calendario. Algunas personas dijeron: "Solo los estudiantes universitarios son lo suficientemente insensatos como para protestar contra un día libre del trabajo". Pero tuvo éxito y el feriado del Día de Colón fue eliminado del calendario de la universidad.

Cristóbal Colón no fue un santo, particularmente en sus últimos años como gobernador de las tierras que la Corona Española puso bajo su control. Atrocidades contra los pueblos indígenas ocurrieron bajo su gobierno, ya sea que él las ordenó o estuvo de acuerdo con ellas o no, y su reputación ha sufrido mucho como resultado. Pero no es por estas acciones que Colón fue honrado. Más bien, si nos tomamos el tiempo de leer sus escritos y los de los historiadores de su tiempo, para comprender sus intenciones al emprender el viaje, para entender por qué lo arriesgó todo para navegar en aguas desconocidas, podemos descubrir que Colón estaba motivado no sólo por el deseo de riqueza o poder o fama (que forman parte de la historia), sino que también fue motivado profundamente por la fe.

Cristóbal Colón era amigo de los frailes franciscanos y era miembro de la Tercera Orden de San Francisco. Cuando se sintió desanimado por la falta de apoyo inicial para su viaje, los frailes alentaron su sueño y le aseguraron contactos en la Corte Real para ganar el apoyo del rey Fernando y la reina Isabel. Colón se quedó en un convento franciscano mientras se preparaba para su primer viaje y celebró con ellos la fiesta franciscana de Nuestra Señora de los Ángeles el día antes de su partida. Confió el éxito del viaje a la Santísima Virgen, rezaba la Liturgia de las Horas todos los días y ordenaba a los marineros que cantaran con él la Salve Regina cada puesta de sol. Avistaron y pisaron tierra por primera vez en la fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Pilar (12 de octubre). Arrodillado en oración, Colón dio gracias a Dios por permitirle llevar el mensaje de salvación a esta parte del mundo. En su segundo viaje, invitó a cinco sacerdotes (incluidos tres franciscanos) para que lo acompañaran como los primeros misioneros a los pueblos de las Américas. Este fue el comienzo de la expansión más fenomenal de la Fe Católica desde la época de San Pablo. Como mencioné al principio, las Escrituras hoy nos ofrecen historias de fe y gratitud. Me atrevo a decir que, aún con nuestras muchas imperfecciones, el Espíritu Santo continúa inspirando, a lo largo de la historia humana, nuevas historias de fe y gratitud, si tenemos el corazón y los ojos abiertos para verlas y para tomar nuestro papel en las historias que se desarrollan ahora.
