

DRESS CODE: WINTER FORMAL

LADIES

DRESSES ONLY: must be formal, long, appropriately fitting, and modest.

- Hemlines for dresses must be long all around the dress (no high-low hems). No sheer long dresses.
- Slits in dresses must be no shorter than 3 inches above the knee.
- No skin-tight dresses.
- No immodest low necklines, visible midriffs or cut-outs/sheer panels or bare backs below the traditional bra line.
- The top of the dress can be no lower than an imaginary line drawn across the student's chest level to the armpits.
- Dress shoes must be worn. No crocs, flip-flops, tennis shoes, boots, or slippers are allowed.
- No hats, bandannas, or inappropriate head wear of any kind.
- No pierced body parts are to be visible except one earring in each ear lobe.

Anyone who, in the Administration's judgment, is dressed inappropriately will not be allowed in the dance. Please make any alterations **BEFORE** arriving at the dance. Corrections **WILL NOT** be made at the door.

GENTLEMEN

- Dress suit or sport coat with collard shirt and traditional tie. Dress shirts must be tucked in at all times.
- Dress shoes and dress socks.
- No hats, bandannas, or inappropriate head wear of any kind.
- No pierced body parts are to be visible.

FYI - All dances have a "Lock-in" policy. Students must arrive during the first hour of the dance and may not leave until the final half-hour of the dance. For the Winter Formal, lock-in is from 9:00 – 10:30pm. A student who arrives late for a school dance will not be admitted. Any exceptions to the "lock-in" policy must be approved in writing in advance by the Assistant Principal.

Students may not enter the dance with props, accessories, knapsacks, or book bags.

Behavior: Cabrini students are responsible for their behavior and that of their dates. Gentlemen escorts must sign in with an ID. They must act in accordance with the rules of Cabrini High School. Students who violate these rules will be subject to having their school ID confiscated and returned to their home school.

Anyone who violates the rules of good conduct, brings alcoholic beverages, drugs or illegal substances to the dance, or exhibits behavior showing the effects of alcohol or drugs will be subject to **severe** disciplinary action.
