ark's Gospel tells us that Jesus sent out the Twelve. These twelve were selected from among Jesus' disciples and named by Mark. Mark notes that these twelve are also called "apostles." The word apostle means "one who is sent." The number twelve is also a symbolic number, representing the twelve tribes of Israel. By naming twelve apostles, Jesus shows his mission to be in continuity with the mission of God's people, Israel.

Jesus' instructions to the apostles are very specific. He repeats the mission that they are sent to preach and to share his authority to heal and to drive out demons. Jesus sends them in pairs, establishing his mission as a communal endeavor. Jesus also instructs them to travel lightly, without the customary food, money, and extra set of clothes. These instructions mean that the Twelve will be dependent on the hospitality of others, just as Jesus depended on others to provide for his needs.

Jesus continues to send us into the world as his disciples. But like the first disciples, we are not sent alone. Jesus has given us the community of the Church, which strengthens our life of discipleship. The Christian message can only authentically be proclaimed in and through the community of faith that is the Church. In our work with others, we build this community of faith and can invite others to share in it.

The months of June and July were filled with African-American Cultural activities in New Orleans.

June 3 – On the feast of Corpus Christi at Corpus Christi Church in New Orleans, the Spring Gospel Concert was performed by the Archdiocesan Black Catholic Choir.

June 19 – 20 - The annual FR. CLARENCE RIVERS GOSPEL MUSIC INSTITUTE was held at Xavier University in New Orleans. Liturgical music directors, musicians, dancers and choirs attended from around the nation.

June 20 – 23 - Archbishop LYKE ANNUAL CONFERENCE was held at Xavier University, NOLA. There were various educational, cultural and spiritual workshops for participants from around the nation.

July 7 – The annual Ancestors Commemoration "Maafa" was held at Congo Square (place of former slave market) in New Orleans. The ceremony commemorates the "rite of passage" of slaves who perished during the painful voyage to New Orleans. After the ceremony, participants visited and prayed at the "TOMB OF THE UNKOWN SLAVE" outside the oldest African American Church St. Augustine in New Orleans.

July 5-8 – the annual ESSENCE FESTIVAL was celebrated with people from other states and other countries. It is a festival of African music and arts with workshops on social, cultural and spiritual themes.

People of New Orleans know how to celebrate with music, dance, parades, praise and worship and the colors and sounds are awesome and memories of welcoming smiles will remain for all who participate.
