OCTOBER 6, 2019 - 27TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



n today's Gospel we hear Jesus teach about faith and service to God. The context is a continuing dialogue between Jesus and his followers about what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. Jesus has just finished an instruction on sin and forgiveness. There are two related teachings that Jesus offers to his disciples when they cry out for an increase in faith. The first is the familiar reminder that faith, even just a little, will enable the followers of Jesus to do wondrous things. But this uplifting and inspiring teaching is quickly followed by the second teaching, a caution about knowing one's place in God's plans. The disciples of Jesus are to understand themselves as servants to God and his plans. Even when God works wonders through us, with our mustard seed-sized faith, we must not seek praise. Our participation in God's plans is God's grace to us—nothing more, nothing less. When we are graced enough to cooperate with God, the work we do is nothing more than our obligation to God as faithful stewards. And yet, our faith enables us to believe that what we have offered in service to God, as his servants, can be made to produce a hundredfold.

My dear brother and sisters in Christ:

Last Friday, we celebrated the feast of St. Francis of Assisi the co-patron of our church.

St. Francis founded 3 Orders while he was living 800 years ago. The 1st Order of Franciscan Friars are Brothers and some are ordained. We are familiar with our 3 Brothers and 3 priests at SMA.

The 2nd Order are Poor Clare Nuns who with St. Clare of Assisi received their way of life from St. Francis and continue today as the largest Religious Order in the Church with Approximately 20,000 members worldwide. There are Poor Clare Nuns at the monastery on Henry Clay Avenue in New Orleans.

The 3rd Order of Lay Franciscans are men and women who received their way of life from St. Francis and continued in their vocations and professions. It is a real Order whose rule is recognized by the Church and is the largest lay Order with approximately 500,000 members worldwide. There are lay Franciscans fraternities in and around New Orleans. Saint King Louis IX is patron of the City of New Orleans and member and patron of the 3rd Order.

The 3rd Order Religious are men and women who accepted the way of life of St. Francis and founded Franciscan Sisters & Brothers communities. We have Franciscan Missionaries of Hope in our Archdiocese of New Orleans at Resurrection Church.
