June 28, 2020 — Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



oday's Gospel is the conclusion of the instructions and consolations that we have heard Jesus offering to his disciples during the past few weeks. In this passage, Jesus summarizes both the costs of discipleship and its rewards. Once again our understanding of the Gospel is strengthened by considering the context in which it was written and the perspective of Matthew's audience.

The conditions of discipleship outlined in Matthew's Gospel may appear harsh. Yet they underline for us a truth—choosing anything with one's whole heart has consequences. Choosing life with Christ means that every relationship we have must be understood from a new perspective. For many in Matthew's community, this choice brought division to their family.

Matthew also outlines the reward of hospitality offered to Jesus' followers. In today's Gospel, Jesus explains the difficulties of discipleship, yet reveals that those who welcome the disciples have also welcomed him.

Today's Gospel also highlights for us the importance of hospitality in the Christian life. To welcome another in Jesus' name is to extend hospitality to Jesus himself. We have many opportunities in our daily life to reach out to others, to be a welcoming presence and a sign of God's love.

O Lord!
We are burdened indeed.
We have poisoned the air, neglected the inequities, and there is this virus.

Augustine told us m you came so that "The Bread might hunger, that The Fountain might thirst, that The Way might be tired on his journey, that The Truth might be accused of false witness, and that The Healer might be wounded."

You know our humanity so well, and the suffering we can cause. So, Jesus, we come to you. Please show us your heavenly Father, who loves every hair on our head.

Let us learn from you, and follow you, and follow you, and find rest.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

Last June 5th, I joined more than 200 people who peacefully marched from the Archdiocese of New Orleans Administration Building to Notre Dame Seminary for a prayer service entitled "Requiem for the Black Children of God." It was a diverse crowd of black & white children, students, adults, religious Sisters and clergy especially from our Cathedral Deanery along with Archbishop Aymond, Bishop Cheri and former Archbishop Hughes were represented.

The service remembered and prayed for dozens of African-American men and women who had died tragically under the hands of police or others in authority. The names of 49 African-Americans were read to the crowd with each name punctuated by the clang of a gong. Indeed a sad and reflective moment.

"Enough is enough," said Bishop Cheri. "We must stand up and profess that human dignity and value at every level is the true issue of right to life...My brother has a knee on his neck. Am I not my brother's keeper."

"The good news is that the people who have joined today know that we must do better. We can do better and we have to do it together." Said Bishop Cheri.

In the coming months, SMA will address the issue of systematic racism so that as a Christian Community we can do better and become a light to the world and an instrument of God's peace.
