#### February 7, 2021 — 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

oday we continue to read from Mark's Gospel, learning more about the ministry of Jesus. Jesus cured Simon's mother-inlaw, and she immediately began to serve Jesus and his disciples. Jesus also cured many others who were brought to him, healing their illnesses and driving out demons. As we will see throughout Mark's Gospel, Jesus did not permit the demons to speak because they knew his identity and would have revealed it to those who were present.

On the morning after this busy day, Jesus retreated in prayer, but was pursued by Simon and others who brought news that many people were looking for him. At this point in Mark's Gospel, we begin to see a distinct role for the inner circle of Jesus' disciples—they act as intermediaries between Jesus and the people. Jesus reports to his disciples that they need to leave Capemaum to preach in other places.

Today's Gospel completes a picture of Jesus' ministry: preaching, curing the sick, driving out demons, and then moving on to continue this work in another place. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee.

Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness.

In today's Gospel we also notice the importance of prayer in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the disciples found him, he told them that it was time to move on. We believe that in his prayers Jesus found guidance and direction from God. We also bring our decision-making to God in prayer, asking for his guidance and direction in our lives.

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#### My dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

In this year of the Eucharist, we continue our explanation of the parts of the Mass by focusing on the **beginning**. The Church being gathered here together in the presence of Jesus Christ who comes to us – as a people of God – to heal, calm, and restore our souls.

The **entrance procession** moves from the doors of the church to the sanctuary. The priest and ministers (who represent all of the people of God) symbolically move from the ordinary (the world) to the extraordinary (the sanctuary, a symbol of heaven itself) – from the secular to the sacred, the everyday to the eternal.

Upon entering the sanctuary, the priest immediately **reverences the altar** with a kiss. The altar represents Christ himself. When we see the priest kiss the altar, we reverence the Lord in our hearts. The altar is the place at which the saving mysteries are carried out, and the center of the assembly, to which the greatest reverence is due.

After the priest reverences the altar, we begin with the **Sign of the Cross** which is a prayer in and of itself. This prayer/sign contains the two greatest mysteries of our Christian faith. The mystery of the Trinity affirming our faith in the Father/Son/Holy Spirit. We also recall our baptism when we were baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The first moments of Mass must not be overlooked. This is why it is so important to prepare our minds and hearts for Mass by arriving early and quieting our souls to see God!

These explanations provided by the Archdiocesan Year of the Eucharist Commission raise our awareness and inspire us to deepen our love and devotion in celebrating our Eucharist.
