March 14, 2021 — Fourth Sunday of Lent



oday's Gospel reading is taken from John's Gospel. It consists of two parts. The first part is the final sentence of Jesus' reply to Nicodemus, the Pharisee who approached Jesus at night. Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus as someone who had come from God and seemed to want to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus greeted Nicodemus with the observation that one must be born from above to see the Kingdom of God. The dialogue between Jesus and Nicodemus that followed was about the meaning of this phrase. Nicodemus misunderstood Jesus at every point, but there was no animosity in the questions he posed to Jesus.

In the part of the conversation with Nicodemus in today's Gospel, Jesus referred to an incident reported in the Old Testament. When the Israelites grumbled against the Lord during their sojoum in the desert, God sent venomous serpents to punish them for their complaints. The Israelites repented and asked Moses to pray for them. The Lord heard Moses' prayer and instructed him to make a bronze serpent and mount it on a pole. All who had been bitten by a serpent and then looked upon the bronze serpent were cured. By recalling this story, Jesus alludes to the salvation that would be accomplished through his death and Resurrection.

The second part of today's Gospel is a theological reflection on Jesus' words to Nicodemus. The Gospel of John is known for this kind of reflection offered within the narrative. The words of the Evangelist are in continuity with the words of the prologue to John's Gospel. In these reflections, John elaborates on a number of themes that are found in his Gospel: light and darkness, belief and unbelief, good and evil, salvation and condemnation.

In John's reflection, we find an observation about human sinfulness. Jesus is the light that has come into the world, but people preferred the darkness. We wish to keep our sins hidden, even from God. Jesus has come into the world to reveal our sins so that they may be forgiven. This is the Good News; it is the reason for our rejoicing in this season of Lent and throughout our lives. <u>loy-olapress.com</u>

REFLECTIONS FOR NEXT WEEK'S READINGS - MARCH 21, 2021 - Fifth Sunday of Lent

THE FIRST READING JEREMIAH 31:31-34
I will be their God and they will be my people.

God writes on hearts, not on stone tablets now. He is our God and we are his people. We find him in all things new. The God of surprises loves us, forgives and forgets our sins.

THE SECOND READING HEBREWS 5:7-9 He offered prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears...

> Jesus you knew fear. You called for help. With loud cries. Your tears knew our worst pain. Yet you pick us up, you hold us and you weep with us. We give great thanks to you, Savior, friend.

THE GOSPEL JOHN 12:20-33 I am troubled now. Yet what should say? 'Father save me from this hour.'

Jesus,

You are troubled now by unclean water, by friends being trafficked. by racial injustice, starving children and all the dying from a virus and deluge of drugs and guns.

What can we say but, we call your name. We beg you to be with us now. Help us right the wrongs, not counting the cost, and become abundant fields of wheat for you.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

In this year of the Eucharist, we continue our explanation of the parts of the Mass by focusing on The Penitential Act and the Gloria.

At the beginning of each Mass, we take time to prepare ourselves through the Penitential Act to enter into the sacred liturgy and encounter Christ. We ask God to help us that by acknowledging our sins we may prepare ourselves to listen to God's Word and share in the Body and Blood of Christ. We recognize our need for God's help - our need to be saved - so we ask his mercy upon us: "Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.'

Immediately following this (on Sundays outside of Advent and Lent and on solemnities, feasts, and at other solemn celebrations) we join the angels and saints in heaven and sing the Gloria – the same hymn sung by the angels to the shepherds heralding the birth of Jesus (Christmas). The incamation is God's response to our sinfulness! During Lent and Advent, we do not sing the Gloria due to the penitential nature of the seasons and the emphasis on expectancy.

In these seemingly routine moments of the Mass that we can become all too familiar with, the Lord invites us to bring our minds and hearts into the deep mystery of our faith - God so loves us that he sent his Son. Jesus has come not to condemn the world, but to save the
