May 15, 2022 — Fifth Sunday of Easter



 Γ oday's Gospel again comes from the Gospel of John. Like last week, today we hear words spoken by Jesus before his death and Resurrection. Jesus is teaching at the Last Supper.

John's Gospel does not include an institution of the Eucharist narrative; instead, Jesus washes his disciples' feet. Immediately after, Jesus predicts his betrayal by Judas. Today's Gospel follows that prediction. It can be read as a continuing explanation of Jesus' act of washing his disciples' feet. It begins with the announcement that this is the moment when the Son of Man will be glorified. This theme continues throughout John's Passion. Jesus will be glorified in his death on the cross and in his Resurrection, and the disciples will glorify Jesus in the love they show.

John's Gospel does not present a sentimental view of love. This is a type of love that is shown in service and sacrifice. It is difficult to choose to love when faced with hatred and anger. Jesus tells the disciples that all will know that they are his disciples because of the love they show for one another. This description of the early Christian community will be repeated in the Acts of the Apostles: "See how they love one another." Christian love is the hallmark of Christianity. We see it lived in the witness of the martyrs. We see it in the example of the lives of the saints. We see it in the holy women and men who live and love daily, making small and large sacrifices for others.

THE GOSPEL

And we will come to him and make our dwelling with him.

He was so sad.

The Risen, Lord had to go away from earth.

Yet he loved them so much that he could not lose them from his life. He would place his Spirit deep within them.

O Holy Spirit, teacher of all good, remind us of what Jesus said and did, and who he is.

Let our hearts be untroubled and fearless as we take your compassion everywhere it's needed in our world today: death row, the unhoused, the climate crisis, Ukraine, and to everyone suffering from bias.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

We have just received a Call to Prayer and Fasting Message from Archbishop Aymond.

In the past week we have heard that some abortion advocates are calling for nationwide demonstrations, disruptions of church services, and the personal intimidation of specific Supreme Court justices in response to the leak of a draft opinion in the U.S. Supreme Court case of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization.

In response to this, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) invited the faithful to unite in fasting and prayer on Friday, May 13. Please see below for their complete statement.

"In the midst of current tensions, we invite Catholics around the country to join us in fasting and praying the Rosary on Friday, May 13, the Memorial of Our Lady of Fatima.

Let us offer our prayers and fasting for these intentions:

- · For our nation, for the integrity of our judicial system, and that all branches of government be dedicated to seeking the common good and protecting the dignity and rights of the human person, from conception to natural death.
- · For the overturning of Roe v. Wade and Planned Parenthood v. Casey in the Supreme Court's final decision in Dobbs v. Jackson.

· For the conversion of the hearts and minds of those who advocate for abortion.

- · For a new commitment to building an America where children are welcomed, cherished, and cared for, where mothers and fathers are encouraged and strengthened; and where marriage and the family are recognized and supported as the true foundations of a healthy and flourishing society.
- · For Our Blessed Mother's intercession and guidance as the Church continues to walk with mothers and families in need, and continues to promote alternatives to abortion, and seeks to create a culture of life.

As Catholics, let us witness to the beautiful gift of life with civility and love, and with our peaceful prayers and our compassionate service to all those in need."

My brothers and sisters, since this message arrived so late it is difficult to make a Day of Prayer and fasting on May 13th. However, we are all encouraged to choose another day for this important intention.
