June 12, 2022 — Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity



This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons.

The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In the early part of this discourse, as we saw last week on Pentecost, Jesus offers assurances to the disciples. Even though he must leave the disciples, he tells them that they will have a future because of the help he will send them in the Holy Spirit. In this section he focuses more on the shape of the future, which will include Jesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. They can only know that, whatever shape the future takes, they will not have to face it alone. They have the Spirit of Truth, who will continue to provide the teaching of Jesus in the future.

Reading this passage on Trinity Sunday reinforces our understanding of the unity shared by the members of the Trinity. Although the idea of one God in three persons remains a mystery, we have the assurance that, as Jesus and the Father share all, Jesus and the Spirit share all.

REFLECTIONS FOR NEXT WEEK'S READINGS - JUNE 19, 2022 – *The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ*

THE FIRST READING

GENESIS 8:22-31

In those days, Melchizedek, king of Salem, brought out bread and wine.

Melchizedek carried bread and wine to Abram.

Jesus, you bring your body and blood, in the shape of bread and wine, to our table.

Loaves and fishes, body and blood. You are love in abundance.

THE SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 11:23-26

This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

Next weekend we wish Happy Father's Day to all fathers, grandfathers, stepfathers, fathers-in-law, and god-fathers. We will honor and pray at Mass for God's blessing on all our fathers both living and deceased. What makes the Christian vocation of fatherhood is that "the love of parents is the means by which God our Heavenly Father show his own love" (Amoris Laetitia).

Next weekend our country will celebrate Emancipation Day or Juneteenth Federal Holiday.

On June 19, 1865, Union troops arrived in Galveston, Texas to tell the state's enslaved people they were free. This came more than two months after the end of the Civil War, and years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation (which freed enslaved people on paper, but not right away in practice). The former slaves immediately began to celebrate with prayer, feasting, song and dance.

While designating Juneteenth as a holiday raises awareness of an important historical moment, Bernice King, CEO of The King Center, a social change nonprofit, and Martin Luther King Jr.'s daughter, said Congress needs to do more than take ceremonial action. She called on lawmakers to pass legislation to prevent police violence and voter suppression.
