"When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do." Luke 17:10b

This is a hard command to live. Most often when we have done something well, and fulfilled our duty, we seek recognition and praise. We want to be noticed. And while this may be a "normal" reaction, it's not the most humble reaction. Humility comes in many degrees, and the deepest degree of humility allows a person to repeat this passage above and mean it.

First, we must realize that the will of God is good for us. It imposes an obligation of love on us. When we fulfill God's will, we should take delight in that fact alone because it is good. That way, the fulfillment of God's will becomes the source of our joy, not the recognition of others.

On the other hand, it is good when we see goodness in others and acknowledge it. We should do this not to build up their ego but to give praise to God for the good thing done. And when others see and acknowledge God's will accomplished in our lives, we must accept their praise not as a source of our pride but as an honest acknowledgment that God is good and His will is being fulfilled. We must be grateful that we could do "what we were obliged to do."

Embracing the will of God as a holy "obligation" also enables us to fulfill it more fully. When doing the will of God is seen as something extraordinary, we may not build a proper habit of fulfilling it. But when it's seen as our duty of love and as the normal act we should fulfill, it's easier to embrace His will more completely.

Reflect, today, on this humble phrase. "We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do." Try to say it, mean it and let it become the foundation of your daily service of God's will. Doing so will set you on the "fast track" toward

Lord, I am an unprofitable servant. When I fulfill Your holy will, I acknowledge that this is a holy obligation of love and my most fundamental duty. Help me to see Your will as the most normal part of my daily life. Help me to embrace it with wholehearted faith and obedience. Jesus, I trust in You.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

On Tuesday we will celebrate the feast of St. Francis of Assisi the co-patron of our Church. It will be a joyful and spirit filled celebration with the three Orders of our Franciscan Family together with parishioners and friends. It is a tradition to invite Dominicans and Friar Herman Johnson, OP will give a reflection on St. Francis. During the Feast Day Mass there will be the blessing with the relic of St Francs and after the Mass all will enjoy refreshments and fellowship.

The following is an excerpt from an inspiring reflection by Friar John Barker, OFM on St. Francis and the Eucharist.

"Thomas of Celano, the first biographer of Francis of Assisi, tells us that the saint often used to tell people: 'If I should happen at the same time to come upon any saint coming from heaven and some little poor priest, I would first show honor to the priest, and hurry more quickly to kiss his hands. For I would say to the saint: Hey, St. Lawrence, wait! His hands may handle the Word of Life and possess something more than human!' Such was the love of St. Francis for the Eucharist.

God gives us everything we need to attain all of God's gracious promises. Especially, he gives us himself in the body and blood of his Son. In the words of St. Francis, 'O how holy and how loving, gratifying, humbling, peaceable: to have such a Brother and such a Son, our Lord Jesus Christ,' who offered himself and still offers himself for us. The saint's words prompt us to consider how we ought to respond to such a great gift, which is, after all, offered to us out of the infinite goodness of God's humble heart."

May this feast inspire us to "pour out our hearts to Jesus" and to respond to the humble goodness of God in the Eucharist.
