October 30, 2022 Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time



"Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." Luke 19:5

Zacchaeus was up a tree. Why? Practically speaking, he was up a tree because he was short and he wanted to see Jesus as Jesus passed by. But the symbolism reveals far greater meaning.

The first thing we must note is that Zacchaeus was a wealthy and well respected man. In the eyes of the world he was successful. But despite his wealth, it appears there was something missing. He heard about Jesus and desired to know Him. This passage is fascinating because it must have been an unusual sight to see a wealthy and successful man climbing a tree in the presence of a large crowd. In fact, it was so unusual that Jesus immediately noticed it.

Jesus also noticed Zacchaeus because of something far more significant than a grown man climbing a tree. Zacchaeus was noticed by Jesus primarily because Jesus was able to perceive the desire and openness of his heart. Zacchaeus, this wealthy and successful man, was missing something and he was zealous to obtain it. He longed for Jesus and this desire is fulfilled by the compassion of our Lord.

Regardless of whether or not you are "successful" from a worldly point of view, it's essential that you, too, recognize the unfulfilled desire of your heart. That "unfulfilled desire" refers to any way that God is not fully the center of your life. Some people try to fulfill this desire in many worldly ways. But those who are like Zacchaeus will realize that Jesus is the answer. And when someone recognizes this fact, they will go to any length necessary to see Him and be with Him.

Reflect, today, upon a simple question: How far am I willing to go to see Jesus? Are you willing to do anything you have to so as to see Him, hear Him and be with Him? It may take an act of humility and you may have to act in a radical way. Doing so will call out to the heart of our Lord and He will respond to you with much generosity just as He did to Zacchaeus. **mycatholiclife.com**

<u>Concerning Funeral Fees</u> At the most recent Parish Council meeting, a question was raised about the required cost for a Funeral Mass in church. Numerous opinions and recommendations were voiced, resulting in the promise to consult the Archdiocese of New Orleans Policy Handbook published in November 2021. There we read: "The diocesan bishop is competent to enact norms governing the allocation of offerings and stole fees in his diocese. In the Archdiocese of New Orleans, no fees or offerings should be mandated for the celebration of a funeral liturgy or for the use of the parish church." (Section 12.9.1.) The bottom line in this Archdiocesan policy is that no fee can be demanded from a grieving family for a church funeral, but any freewill donation will always be welcomed.

It is with great joy to announce that Mr. Albert Evans III has been selected for the MRS. SOPHIE ARAMBURO servant leader award to be presented by the Archdiocese of New Orleans Office of Black Catholic Ministries on November 5, 2022 at our St. Mary of the Angels Church.

Albert Evans, better known to most as Saint, began his service as an active member to St. Mary of the Angels Church very young as an altar server for most of his formative years. As he transitioned to high school, he joined the Catholic Youth Organization (CYO) as a Counselor for the group. Saint later became a member of All Congregations Together (ACT), supporting social and fund raising activities for the group along with prayer.

After Hurricane Katrina when the levees broke, Saint assisted Father Bart tremendously with securing neighborhood residents to safety on make-shift rafts from their homes to the roof of SMA's school and helping to provide food and care to all for days until they were all rescued by helicopter.

In 2007, Saint was left paralyzed with a brain injury from an unfortunate incident. As he struggled for a very long time fighting for his life, he took his struggles and used them to help other people get through their fight. Through the grace of God, Albert has volunteered weekly at Touro Hospital for over 12 years mentoring other brain and spinal cord injury and stroke patients by motivating and giving them hope for their future. He continued his fight and joined several organizations to network and give back and pass his goodwill onto many others. He is a member of (ABIS) Advocacy Program for Brain and Spinal Cord recovery patients. Saint even shared his encouragement in the sports arena with Touro's Handicapped Softball and Bowling Leagues.

Albert's most dynamic ministry is in delivering daily prayers and uplifting messages to over two-hundred followers via text messaging. Saint currently attends Saturday Mass at SMA and provides the Church with a monthly prayer and motivational message on the first Saturday of every month. He has remained a vital participant in his faith and is always sharing encouragement to all who come in contact with him.

Congratulations Saint and when one member is honored, the whole Church community is honored.
