### November 13, 2022 Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time



"See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them!" <u>Luke 21:8</u>

First, Jesus uses the word "deceived." There will be many false prophets who will have the ability to deceive. They will portray themselves as messengers of the truth and dispensers of the will of God. Their words will be convincing and many will follow.

This tells us that not everyone "speaking in the name of God" is in fact speaking in the "name of God." And even if many others are following, and they are very convincing, this is not proof that the person is a true prophet of the Lord.

How do we discern when someone is speaking from the heart of Jesus? Ultimately, this can only be done through a state of pray-

er. Being in a "state of prayer" means that our hearts are attuned to God's voice. When God speaks through this or that person and our hearts are tuned into Him, we will simply know His voice as it is spoken through this or that person.

Conversely, when we are living in a state of true prayer and then someone speaks a false and deceiving message, something will not sit well with us. There will be a sense in the depths of our souls that something is not right. It will be a spiritual sense and this is a result of the healthy working of our conscience. There are external guides such as the revealed teaching of the Church and the counsel of other good Christians, but in the end we must allow God to speak within our consciences and follow His voice in this holy sanctuary.

## Concerning Funeral Fees

At the most recent Parish Council meeting, a question was raised about the required cost for a Funeral Mass in church. Numerous opinions and recommendations were voiced, resulting in the promise to consult the Archdiocese of New Orleans Policy Handbook published in November 2021. There we read: "The diocesan bishop is competent to enact norms governing the allocation of offerings and stole fees in his diocese. In the Archdiocese of New Orleans, no fees or offerings should be mandated for the celebration of a funeral liturgy or for the use of the parish church." (Section 12.9.1.) The bottom line in this Archdiocesan policy is that no fee can be demanded from a grieving family for a church funeral, but any free-will donation will always be welcomed.

## My dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

Last Friday was Veterans Day, a federal holiday observed annually on November 11th to honor military veterans of the United States Armed Forces. Thus, this holiday weekend, we have the opportunity to pay our respects to those who have served, our veterans.

Three ways to thank veterans especially SMA veterans on Veterans Day.

1. It's a chance to thank people for risking their lives to defend America

An estimated 20% of veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan suffer from PTSD or major depression, according to government statistics. You'd be surprised at how much it means to veterans to feel valued by civilians for their services and sacrifices.

2. It's a chance to reflect on the importance of peace

While our military is often thought of in a war context, most veterans will tell you that they risked their lives to defend our fundamental freedoms and that they value peace much more highly than war. Very few who have seen the real horror of war are anxious to rush into it, and Veterans Day encourages all of us to reflect on the value of harmony and peace in our daily interactions and lives.

3. It draws attention to the challenges facing many veterans

Veterans face disproportionate rates of homelessness, deficits in educational achievement, a struggle to find employment, and often have to deal with devastating wounds. By understanding these challenges, we can all reach across those divides and make sure veterans have the best possible chance of having a healthy and fulfilling life after their service.

Lord God, Almighty Father, creator of humankind and author of peace, we ask you to bless the members of our armed forces. May they ever experience your firm support, gentle love and compassionate healing. To you be all glory, honor and praise, now and forever. Amen.
