"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net thrown into the sea, which collects fish of every kind. When it is full they haul it ashore and sit down to put what is good into buckets. What is bad they throw away. Thus it will be at the end of the age. The angels will go out and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth." Matthew 13:47–50

This parable is the third of three parables Jesus tells in a row. The first compares the Kingdom of Heaven to a "treasure buried in a field." When a person finds it, they sell everything they have so as to buy that field. The second parable likens the Kingdom of Heaven to a merchant who is in search of fine pearls. "When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all that he has and buys it." In both of these parables, the discovery of the Kingdom of Heaven is a great joy. The person discovering the treasure or the pearl is so elated that he is willing to trade all that he has so as to obtain it.

The third of these three parables, however, is much different. In this case, the Kingdom of Heaven is likened to a net that gathers all people at the end of the age and separates them, the good from the bad. The parable then concludes with a frightening image. The wicked will be thrown "into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth."

In the end, for those who enter the glories of Heaven, there will be unending joy. And this fact must be understood so as to draw us into those riches of grace. Anticipation of such a gift should motivate us to diligently seek out the many graces our Lord wishes to bestow upon us. But sometimes we need a bit more of a nudge. We can easily become complacent in our life of faith and our search for God's will. For that reason, Jesus includes the third parable, outlining the consequences some will endure at the end of time. Though it might not be a happy thought, it is a holy thought because it reveals God's definitive justice and judgment at the end of time.

Do you believe in the Justice of God? Do you believe that He will exact definitive judgment upon those who reject His holy will in this life? Do you believe that Hell is real and is a possibility for us all? If this thought is difficult to accept, then it might be worth further prayerfully pondering this third parable. Justice and judgment are real. If we are not fully motivated in life to diligently seek out the glory of the Kingdom of Heaven, then we should at least honestly face the reality of the consequences that await. **mycatholiclife.com**



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

On Wednesday August 2nd, our Church will celebrate the Feast of our patroness St. Mary of the Angels and the 98th anniversary of the founding of our SMA Church. In the Spring of 1925, the Most Rev. John Shaw, Archbishop of New Orleans Archdiocese, invited the Franciscan Friars from Cincinnati to assume the care of a proposed parish in the Upper 9th Ward, later named St. Mary of the Angels Church. It was on August 2, 1925 that the first Mass was celebrated with about 60 people present in a temporary church on Congress Street. So, in slightly more than one year (2025) our SMA church will be celebrating its muchanticipated centennial jubilee.

The title St. Mary of the Angels is very dear to our Franciscan family because St. Francis had a special love for a neglected, simple chapel dedicated to Blessed Mary in the woods near Assisi. St. Francis learned from spiritual experiences while praying there that this chapel was filled with rich grace and often visited by heavenly spirits. So, he often said to the friars, "my sons, see that you never abandon this place... for this place is holy indeed; it is the dwelling place of Christ and His Virgin Mother."

Throughout the 100 years, the people of SMA demonstrated faithfulness and resilience in encountering many natural and social challenges. The first wood structured church burned down and the people worked to replace it. In 1965 Hurricane Betsy destroyed the second church building and the people were determined to build a large, beautiful, strong building. Then in 2005 Hurricane Katrina flooded and destroyed property in the city of New Orleans. The people once again were determined that SMA church & school would remain open and worked hard to clean and repair the church, rectory and school and convinced the Archbishop to keep SMA open for worship and as a community center.

SMA Church is the people of God. SMA people are still faithful and resilient and determined to continue as a place of worship and a Light of hope to the Upper 9th Ward for years to come so help us God.
