
After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." Mark 1:14–15

Jesus begins His public ministry immediately after being tempted by the devil while in the desert for forty days. As He begins His ministry, He declares: "This is the time of fulfillment." First, the beginning of Jesus' public ministry was, historically speaking, the "time of fulfillment," in that the new era of the Gospel and grace had just begun. But the "time of fulfillment" of which Jesus speaks also refers to each and every time that we hear the Gospel and respond. We do this by sincerely repenting of our sins and by becoming a fuller member of God's Kingdom. But ponder for a moment the specific word "fulfillment." What does this mean?

The word "fulfilled" can be contrasted with its opposite "unfulfilled." To be unfulfilled is always undesirable. In this world, many people find themselves unfulfilled and try to fill this void with many things. Interestingly, the three temptations that Jesus had just experienced in the desert are among the temptations that so many people give into during their search for fulfillment in life.

First, Jesus was hungry, and the devil tempted Him to turn stones into bread to satiate that hunger. This is a temptation to fleshly fulfillment. Second, the devil tempted Jesus to throw Himself off the pinnacle of the Temple to prove He was the Son of God. This is a temptation to fulfillment by pride—pride to convince another of one's importance and identity. Third, the devil showed Jesus all the nations of the world and promised them to our Lord if Jesus worshiped him. This is a temptation to fulfillment by obtaining earthly wealth and power. Of course, Jesus rejected all three temptations as a way of showing that none of these truly fulfill us. And He did this just prior to the beginning of His public ministry so as to then go forth preaching the true message of fulfillment. "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

True fulfillment is only found in the Gospel, the message of Truth that Jesus shared during His three years of public ministry and then brought to completion by His sacrificial death and resurrection. Only those who heed His words and open themselves to the grace poured forth from the Cross are able to find the fulfillment that they seek. mycatholiclife.com

"Christmas at Greccio" Indulgence
This year is the 800th Anniversary of Christmas in Greccio. Greccio is the city in Italy where St. Francis of Assisi displayed the very first nativity scene. Pope Francis recently granted to all churches entrusted to Franciscan care (like St. Mary of the Angels in New Orleans; also the Poor Clare Monastery on Henry Clay) the possibility for all faithful Catholics to receive a plenary indulgence, under the usual conditions, from December 8, 2023 to February 2, 2024. An indulgence is God's remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven in the Sacrament of Penance.

The "usual conditions" are:

*a Catholic in the state of grace

*an indulgence can be gained only once a day

recent reception of the Sacrament of Penance

recent reception of Holy Communion

*a prayer for the intentions of the Pope

It will be very convenient for any SMA parishioner, or any other person seeking the indulgence, to complete these "conditions" before or after any weekday or Sunday Mass before the deadline.

Dear Colleague in Christ,

September 9, 2024 (feast of St. Peter Claver) will mark the 40th anniversary of the pastoral letter of the Black Catholic bishops, <u>What We Have Seen and Heard</u>. Following upon three workshops that the Subcommittee on African American Affairs of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops sponsored at last summer's Black Catholic Congress XIII, we think it opportune to punctuate this anniversary by inviting Catholic communities to revisit this landmark statement.

There are a number of ways in which we can do this, including: special focus with homilies or speakers, small groups or days of reflection with the text of the pastoral; highlighting select quotes from the pastoral monthly on your local web pages and social media outlets; special paraliturgies, like prayer services; or focusing on select themes addressed in the pastoral, for example, the imperative topics of evangelization or Black Catholic history.

We enclose with this note a copy of the text of the pastoral along with the original <u>study-guide</u> to help with planning at your end. Also included with this note is a link to a video of Bishop Terry Steib's <u>presentation</u> on the pastoral at Congress XIII.

May we take this opportunity during the year that barely begins to hear again the voice of our bishops leading us to fruitful pastures of ministry, education and ownership of our Catholic faith and traditions.
