“Just Keep Paddling”

Last Sunday I took advantage of the opportunity to spend the afternoon at my brother’s lakehouse on Manitou up in Rochester, IN. It was a beautiful day; we couldn’t have asked for better weather.

Sometimes when our family gathers at the lake, we have a houseful. Last Sunday, we just had a handful. Instead of a lot of activity, it turned out to be a day of mostly relaxation. Much-needed relaxation at that.

We decided to take a mid-day pontoon ride around the lake, ultimately dropping anchor for a while so we could float in the water on the innertubes and inflatable rafts. Although the sun was shining bright and the water was a comfortable temperature, the lake was definitely choppy that day. There seemed to be an inordinate amount of waves compared to the minimal number of boats that we encountered.

It didn’t take long to realize how quickly the waves would carry us away from the anchored pontoon if we weren’t careful. It didn’t matter how beautiful the day was or how relaxing it was to just float on the lake like we had no cares in the world. If we weren’t willing to constantly “paddle” as much as possible with our arms and legs while we enjoying the outing, we would have found ourselves quite a distance away from the safety of the pontoon in a very short time. So we had to remind ourselves, “Just keep paddling.”

There were plenty of distractions for sure. Finding “images” in the clouds. An interesting-looking bird flying overhead. Another family cruising by, enjoying a day at the lake. Yes, each one of these “little” distractions in-and-of themselves weren’t bad — but when coupled with the unforgiving, relentless waves that didn’t take a break, we found ourselves a little farther away from the pontoon each time we let something else steal our attention and our focus. On a couple occasions, a big enough wave would come and smack one of us with a face-full of water. While it’s important to stay hydrated when out in the sun, I don’t recommend a mouthful of lakewater.

I realized something while out on the lake last Sunday. That pontoon was like the Church. It was anchored and — regardless of the waves that persisted — that pontoon really wasn’t moving. Those of us on the innertubes and rafts, on the other hand, were being carried away by the waves... unless, of course, we kept paddling. The more distracted we became, the more we forgot to keep ourselves focused on the anchored pontoon, the more distant we found ourselves.

If the Church is our anchored pontoon, what are YOUR waves? What are the distractions that life is throwing your way? Even if life smacks you in the face with a mouthful of nasty water, stay close to Jesus; stay focused on our beautiful faith. And whatever you do, just keep paddling!



Maintenance Crew Is Keeping Busy

During the recent shutdown due to COVID-19, our maintenance and custodial staff has kept busy taking care of a variety of projects around the campus. Ongoing responsibilities, like mowing for example, still needed to be done. But while the campus was basically shut down, the crew was able to check other projects off their "to-do" list as well.

With students and teachers sent home mid-March to do e-learning for the remainder of the semester, the custodians were able to get a little earlier start on working in the school building. They have been stripping the hallway and classroom floors and re-coating them with a fresh coat of wax. Classrooms got a new coat of paint, and the crew deep-cleaned the exterior of the school. In addition, they have been working on preparing the classrooms, cafeteria, and other areas for the safe return of students and teachers next month.

The maintenance and custodial team developed and implemented a disinfecting regimen for the parish office, the Adoration Chapel, and the church/nave. Rob Reed, director of maintenance, built the wood-and-plexiglass guards that are used during the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass; he also built two similar guards to be used during confession. They also painted the northwest and the northeast (elevator) entrances of the church as well as the men's bathroom in the parish hall. They installed new hand dryers in the parish hall bathrooms. In addition, they went through the church — pew by pew — and repaired any loose or broken kneelers.

Since the return to public Mass, our maintenance and custodial crew sanitizes the pews and common areas after each Mass — weekend Masses and daily Masses as well as after weddings and funerals. All of this has been on top of their regular tasks like groundskeeping and cleaning around the campus.

We can't put into words how much we appreciate this group of guys and their dedication to our parish. One of the easiest ways all of us can show our gratitude is by doing our part to take care of our parish grounds and facilities. If you use a tissue, discard it appropriately. If you find a piece of litter on the ground, throw it in the trash. When at Mass, only use the kneeler for its intended purpose — kneeling. More often than not, when the maintenance crew has to replace a broken "foot" on a kneeler, it's because someone used the kneeler as a footrest. If we all do our part to help keep our parish home clean, we can save the team some time and money.
