“Pray for Wisdom”

I don't know about you, but when I am praying I know I need to do a better job of praying for wisdom. Wisdom for myself and wisdom for all people who are in a position of authority. This weekend's first reading, taken from the First Book of Kings, shows young Solomon doing that very thing.

After God told Solomon to ask for anything and He would give it, the young King Solomon prayed, “Give your servant, therefore, an understanding heart to judge your people and to distinguish right from wrong. For who is able to govern this vast people of yours?” — **1 Kings 3:9**

A reminder of the importance of wisdom and prudence flows through this weekend's Gospel from Matthew 13 as well. If a person finds a treasure buried in a field or discovers a pearl of great price, prudence helps them recognize that the value is greater than **everything else** they already possess! So it is, we are told, with the kingdom of heaven. Wisdom helps us realize that there is absolutely **nothing** in this world that should be of more value to us than eternal life in heaven! May we pray for eyes that see, ears that hear, and a heart that understands God's love.

Our world could use an extra dose of wisdom these days. With so many unanswered questions — and conflicting answers — about the virus and how to continue moving forward, we should increase our prayers for wisdom for everyone who is in a position of authority. Government leaders, medical professionals, school administrators and teachers, parents, clergy, business owners — just to name some — all have to make decisions that impact the lives of other people. The criteria they are using to make their decisions continue to change on a daily basis.

Require masks or just recommend them? Plan for a “normal” start to the school year or start out with online teaching? Let the children play in the park or limit their play area to the yard at home? Host the annual parish event or cancel it and hope to bring it back next year? And the questions go on and on and on. (I realize that I'm not telling you anything you don't already know.)

Consider Solomon. He didn't say, “I am the king, so I have all the answers!” He didn't claim to have the best, smartest, and most experienced advisers who would help him make decisions. He didn't insist that he earned the right to tell the people what to do because he was David's son. No, in humility Solomon asked God to grant him the wisdom to know how to be a great, effective leader.

Pleased that Solomon hadn't voiced a selfish request, God said to him, “I do as you requested. I give you a heart so wise and understanding that there has never been anyone like you up to now, and after you there will come no one to equal you.” — **1 Kings 3:12**

Like Solomon, let us ask God for the blessing of wisdom — especially during the most difficult times and with the most difficult decisions. And in wisdom, may we always stay focused on the kingdom of heaven.


Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I love you very much.

The box was installed at Station 1 of the Kokomo Fire Department. K of C chaplain Fr. Matthew Arbuckle blessed and dedicated the box on Thursday, June 11, 2020 with members of Council 656 and local leaders present for the event.

The Baby Box was installed in the east exterior wall of the fire station. It has an exterior door that automatically locks upon placement of a newborn inside the Baby Box, and an interior door which allows fire department staff to secure the surrendered newborn from inside the box. This was the 28th Safe Haven Baby Box installed in the state of Indiana.
