2 Fr. Shocklee's Thoughts

Sacramental Prep & Patience - So, last week we put out our plan for parish Religious Education as a whole, and immediately people said, "but what about 1st Reconciliation, 1st Communion, & Confirmation!!!" Honestly, please be patient. People want a program that's been thought through and they want it before I've had time to think it through. COVID means things aren't the way they normally are. It's not just where we do what we did last year to get through the transition to the new priest. It's taken time for me to understand what has been done in the past, process how we do COVID here, pay attention to what's going on in the schools with COVID, watch where things are going in the Diocese and in the state with COVID, and look at what programs can be done in the context of all of this. And with Confirmation, I needed to have that opportunity to talk to the parents who were available to develop a plan for what works for the busy schedule of high school youth today and the Diocese requirements.

That being said, I'm now comfortable enough to roll out at least as a sketch what we will be doing. For 1st Reconciliation & 1st Communion Prep, this year we will be using the Blessed program put out by Dynamic Catholic. The program can be done by parents with their kids at home. It consists of six sessions with about 7 short videos per session and some workbook work and somethings to do during the week. It's really meant to be a great opportunity for parents to teach their kids the faith. We haven't developed how we will tell if you've done the program yet, but you can feel free to look into it and get started online. It's free online but if you want to have books ordered, let us know and we can try to put in an order. We'll be planning to have 1st Reconciliation during our Advent Penance Service with the rest of the pastorate, but that date is not yet set. We'll have 1st Communion sometime after Easter. For kids that are in the school, I talked with the principal and this year we'll have them go through the Blessed Program in their classes. If we are able to do a retreat as part of the prep, STSJP kids and religious education kids will be together for the retreat, but we are still watching to see what we can do with COVID.

For Confirmation Prep, the parents who came to the meeting and I came up with a program plan. The plan will be that for those who are being Confirmed this year (Sophomores and up) that will consist of 6 Sunday evenings, 3 in a row later this fall and 3 in a row in the Spring, and 1 Saturday retreat. The Sunday evenings will be from 5:30pm – 9pm and include dinner for the youth. We'll be working through these and various details, but we need to know who is going to be in the program this year. If you have a youth to be confirmed, please let the parish offices know. For Freshman, who planned to be Confirmed next year, they need to be involved in our regular religious education program for this year. With that in view, our regular religious education program for high school youth this year will simply be specific events. I'm going to ask that youth attend at least 1/3 of the events (which I'll talk about next week) to count as having been a part of the "normal" religious education program this year.


