#### Dear Parishioners.

True promises are hard to keep. When Jesus was crucified, he suffered not only physical pain, but the spiritual pain of abandonment as well. Many of his closest friends were not to be found at his cross. Only John is mentioned along with some women, including his mother. The scene of Mary and John at the cross is perhaps the most painful and powerful scene in scripture. What kept the others away? Was it fear? Perhaps. Then again, perhaps it was disillusionment. The teachings and promises of Jesus seemed shattered. Were they ever real? Did these disciples feel duped or were they just uncertain what to do next?

Yet, standing by the cross was the mother of Jesus... sharing his pain. Love for her son was more powerful than the fear or disillusion she must have felt. Mary had made a promise. Years before she agreed to cooperate in God's plan to bring His son into our human world. The prophet, Simeon, warned her it would cause her great suffering and pain. Yet she did so because of her love. True promises are hard to keep.

Mary remained faithful even in the face of her son's death and it is this type of faith that has seen the church through even the most difficult and scandalous times. When faced with scandal pain and disillusionment are understandable. But is it reason to leave or stay away? When Christ needed his disciples most, they were not to be found. Jesus' mother, Mary, is the great example of how to remain faithful in the midst of scandal. Her love was the power that could overcome the forces that would keep others away.

During this month of October, I encourage you to pray and meditate on the mysteries of the rosary. Let the faith and love of Mary inspire you for times of trial. She will point you to Christ. Pray that God's people will not abandon the faith in the face of difficult times. Pray they may receive the grace to stand at the cross and to remember...true promises are indeed hard to keep.


