

Dear Parishioners,

Attending Mass: During the month of October, the diocese asks each parish to count the people who attend Mass. It serves a two-fold purpose. First of all, it helps us to evaluate and address the immediate needs of our diocese. Does a parish offer too many Masses? Perhaps the priest's energy could be better used where the need is greater. The second purpose is to measure trends among the Catholic population. Are more going or staying away and what are the reasons? Has the growth in one area simply offset the losses in another? This count is a valuable tool in helping to assess the challenges the Church faces today.

What I know about Blessed Sacrament is that less than 25% of our current parishioners attend Mass on the weekend. This percentage is slightly below the national average. From my observation, attendance seems to be declining although the number of registered families has increased. The average age of our parishioners is also younger than the average. Our school is the largest grade school in the diocese. Is there a correlation? What are we doing to reach out to the young, especially younger parents? Has the sexual abuse scandal hurt our parish and if so, how? What effect does the culture of today's world have and how do we draw people back? Some responses to these questions are simply gimmicks. If you involve the children more, their parents will come. Give tuition breaks to families who attend. Offer doughnuts after Mass. Cater to special groups. They may help raise attendance, but they honestly don't address the issue.

Perhaps a better way is to give people a real reason to come. Here is what I mean.

--People, and especially young families, live busy lives today. It is hard to find time for all the demands put on us. Things get cut or pushed aside without much thought.

Unfortunately, God is often one of those "things". If we don't take time for God, do we honestly think life will get better and we will find the satisfaction we are searching for? Just the opposite will happen and we will soon lose sight of what is really important. Attending Mass allows us to take some time for God. Friends become better friends as they spend more time together.

--Attending Mass offers us grace. Grace is defined as God's love and assistance. Grace is attained when we hear God's word and receive Christ's body and blood in the Eucharist. When you are out in this cold and challenging world, isn't it nice to know that someone is on your side helping you not to compromise the persons you are called to be.

--Attending Mass shows you belong to something bigger than yourself. You are part of God's family where God is your father and Jesus is your brother. He invites you to come over every weekend just like Grandma did.

--Attending Mass allows you to witness to your faith. You may never know how many people are strengthened to live faithful lives when they see you join them at Mass. We all struggle and there is spiritual strength when someone is willing to walk with us.

You may have other reasons for going to Mass, but please don't stop coming; for God is depending on you and that in itself is reason enough.

A high level of participation is needed to aid the bishop in making an informed decision about whether to move forward with a campaign. The Steier Group, a Catholic development fundraising firm, has been hired to conduct the study. A final recommendation on the viability of the campaign will be made in the early December. The study will provide everyone with an opportunity to share their thoughts through a combination of personal interviews, mail/online surveys, and town halls to be held at locations throughout the diocese.
