

Dear Parishioners,

not to do is to make it a "little Lent." There are of course many similarities. Both are times of preparation for major feasts. Both emphasize prayer and penance. Both use the color purple in the ritual. However, the difference is in the tone of the season. Lent is about sin and redemption. We are called to be sorry for our sins and to repent. We are called to accept responsibility for our failings and actively seek forgiveness. Christ's death on the cross is our hope for new life. In other words, the tone of Lent is bittersweet. Advent, on the other hand, is a time to focus on the promised return of Jesus. We are called to be vigilant and prepare for the time of his coming. The tone of Advent is joyful expectation. During the season of Advent, we are reminded on the First Sunday that Jesus is not yet finished with our world. A day will come when he will return. On the second and third week we hear of God's first promise when he told the Israelites he would send a messiah. Hundreds of years passed and many lost hope. Prophets were sent to teach and prepare the people for that time. One of them was John the Baptist. His message was to turn to God and get ready, for the time is at hand. The urgency and excitement of this coming is told to us so that we too will prepare. The final week recalls the story of Mary and Joseph as they make preparations to welcome the promised savior. The season begs the question: are we ready for Lord when he comes?

Decorating our homes, baking and cooking, exchanging gifts are just some of the ways our secular world prepares in this time before Christmas. Yet, offering our prayers, remembering the promise, reflecting on God's word and opening our hearts are the spiritual ways we can use this time; for, unlike Lent, that recalls the bittersweet events of sin and salvation, Advent reminds us of the loving promise of God. He will not abandon us. He will come again in glory. In the meantime we must watch and wait...in joyful expectation.
